Unaudited Interim Report

For the 26 weeks ended 28th July 2018

The total surplus for the Half Year was lower than the figures for the equivalent 26 weeks of the prior year. Whilst sales levels increased, the resulting increase in the total gross profit achieved was less than the increase in expenses across the period. The percentage gross profit achieved by the Food Division showed a decline against the prior year, this was from a number of factors including changes in the mix of goods being sold. Convenience store sales were very strong across the recent summer period, showing an increase against the prior year, but a lot of those additional sales were in product categories that carry lower gross profit levels such as sales of alcohol products and cold drinks. Expense increases were particularly from staffing costs, driven by changes in the national living wage set by legislation, and higher property repair costs. The overall results are slightly favourable to our internal budgets set at the start of the year.

The total net takings for the Half Year ended 28th July 2018 were £13,192,000 and this is an increase of 7.0% on the equivalent interim figures for last year. Overall Food sales are 8.5% ahead of the prior year. In the Funeral Department turnover was ahead of the prior year by 2.5%. Sales details for the Department Store are always more difficult to compare because of the level of third party concession sales. Trading conditions within the Tamworth town centre remain challenging. In the prior interim period the department store made a small contribution towards our overall profitability. In this half year the department store has made a small loss at the contribution level. At the Church Street food premises in the Tamworth town centre there was a small increase in sales but a reduction in the level of contribution achieved. Some work has recently taken place at those premises to reduce the total sales area in use and to introduce more energy efficient LED lighting.

Within the Food Division the key investment during the period has been a comprehensive refit and refurbishment of our Kingsbury convenience store. Whilst the overall sales area has remained the same we have been able to increase the ancillary warehousing area to support the store more fully. All refrigeration has been replaced and that location has just become our first location to offer self-check-out equipment. The location had to close for a 2-week period to enable the work to take place, and that also had an impact on the trading results in the half year. The store has performed strongly in sales terms since the refit. Generally our convenience estate has produced some encouraging sales results across the half year period. A planning application is with the local authority seeking permission to build a new convenience store at the site of the former Cuckoos Rest pub in Dordon, to relocate our operations there.

Overall our Funeral Division delivered a higher contribution level than in the prior year. With a network of 8 individual locations, including the Tamworth Bereavement Centre, the number of arrangements carried out from each location will vary across individual periods. Income from property investments has remained at a very similar level to the prior year and was in line with our expectations. The charge for Pension Financing is £88,000 in this Half Year, down from £100,000 in the previous Half Year. This cost relates to the financing element on the former Final Salary Pension Scheme and is calculated by the Scheme Actuary.

The Society's trading surplus is £585,000; this is a reduction from the result in the equivalent interim period of last year of £38,000 or around 6%, but is in line with our budgeted expectations. The Society continues to expect increasing competition in all of our trading businesses and there remains uncertainty over the general economic climate with political uncertainty and Brexit negotiations. The Society Balance Sheet for the Half Year shows the Society is in a good financial position with net assets that total £13.6m and cash in the Bank of £2.7m. As the Interim Statements indicate no provision has been made for dividends (which are declared at the end of the financial year) or taxation. The Directors would also like to point out that the full year accounts include any revaluation arising from the Society's investment property portfolio which is valued annually by an external professional.

The Society has been very pleased to complete a further round of donations under the successful Community Dividend Scheme during the Half Year. Under this programme each of our retail Branches is linked with a local community group. During the first half of this year our Branch Managers issued donations to 13 local groups at an average individual level of just over £760. Arrangements are currently being made for a further round of donations from our "cash in the bag" scheme, in respect of the proceeds from carrier bag charges.

The Board would like to thank all of our customers and Members for their continued support and all of our staff for their hard work.
