### Committee's Report.

(Fellow Members) we have great pleasure in submitting for your consideration and approval the Forty-first Quarterly. Balance Sheet.

The Sales for the quarter have been £7376 Os. 7d., an increase on last quarter of £183 0s. 54d., and an increase over the corresponding quarter of last year of £1267 12s.5\fmud.

We would point out that the Drapery, Boot & Shoe Sales are not fully represented in Cash Account: Goods have been sent out through the Grocery department to the amount of £74 6s. 3d., bringing the total Sales to £630 3s. 2d., being a decrease of £1 0s.  $1\frac{1}{3}d$ . in these departments during the

The Profits for the quarter, after allowing the usual rate of interest on Share Capital (5 per cent.), Depreciation on Building, Fixtures, and Rolling Stock, and paying all other expenses, is £665 5s.  $8\frac{1}{2}$ d.

The present number of members now standing on the Books of the Society is 1232.

We propose to pay a Dividend of 1s. 10d. in the £ to Members, and 11d. in the £ to Non-members; £9 1s. 4d. Bonus to Employes; £7 to Educational Fund; £4 3s.  $3\frac{1}{2}$ d., to Reserve Fund; and to carry the Balance of £50 to next Quarter.

Contributions are at present received (Penny Bank.) -and withdrawals paid on Saturdays only, from 5 p.m. to 7 p.m.

As you will notice, the sales for the present quarter exceed that of any previous quarter since the commencement of the Society. Therefore the results of the quarter's working must be highly gratifying to all our members. It only needs that the same loyal support be extended to the Society to meet with equal satisfactory results during the ensuing quarter.

No member can hold more than 100 shares on which interest at the rate of 5 per cent. per annum is paid.

Any person wishing to become a Member may do so by applying at the office of the Society, and paying an Entrance Fee of 1s. 2d.

Where the Share or Shares are not paid in full on application, the Members are expected to allow their dividends to remain until at least One Share is fully paid up.

All Profits, after paying working Expenses, Depreciation and Interest on capital, are divided among the purchasers.
