NOTICES.

It is very essential that Members should take notice of the method of conducting business in the Office in relation to Dividends, &c. They will observe that it is very necessary that the rules must be adhered to, and there will be no exception to the following, *i.e.*:—

- (a) No Dividend will be paid unless a Number Ticket is produced, and will only be paid to the Member, or to someone bearing written authority properly written out and duly signed by that Member.
- (b) Our books will be closed for the receiving of contributions and paying of withdrawals during the last week of this quarter, viz., from February 10th to 15th inclusive.
- (c) All Members making withdrawals must bring their Contribution Books to the Secretary, and withdrawals will only be paid to the Member, or to someone bearing written authority signed by that Member.

A notice of authority to draw Dividend will be found at end of this report, and no Dividend will be paid to anyone other than the Member unless this is produced, properly filled up.

The Dividend will be paid at the Stores from Thursday, December 19th, 1901, to Wednesday, December 25th, 1901, during Office hours.

Members' Addresses.—Members changing their residence are requested to inform the Secretary as soon thereafter as possible, stating the number of their Share Book and their new place of abode. Anyone neglecting to do so will be fined threepence in accordance with Rule 32.

Nomination by Members.—Special attention is called to the importance of nomination, by which, on payment of threepence, they may nominate any person or persons to whom their shares and interest in the Society shall be paid at their decease, and thus avoid possible litigation.

Change and Checks.—All customers are specially requested to examine their change and checks and to see that they are correct before leaving the counter, and also to see that a check is given them by the shopmen for each payment made, however small it may be. It is very important that all customers should give their special attention to this, and thus assist the Committee in making the Check System as complete as possible.

COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

FELLOW-MEMBERS,

Again we have the pleasure to place before you another Report and Balance Sheet, this our Sixtieth, showing another series of great results.

It is with confidence we submit it to you for your consideration and adoption.

The Sales amounted to £13,139. 14s. 10½d., an increase over last Quarter of £1,817. 1s. 0½d., and the corresponding Quarter of last year of £1,219. 10s. 11d. From this you will observe we have reached and exceeded the £1,000 per week.

The Profits at your disposal, after allowing for management, depreciation, interest, and all other expenses, are £1,479. 3s. 9d., which we shall propose for you to appropriate as follows:—Dividend to Members at 2s. in the £, £1,280; Dividend to Non-members at 1s. in the £, £3; Educational Committee, £15. 12s.; Bonus to Employés, £17. 5s. 8d.; Plate Glass Insurance Fund, 11s. 3d.; Extra Depreciation on Rolling Stock, £50; Reserve Fund, £12. 14s. 10d.; Carried forward to next Quarter, £100.

The membership of the Society at the end of the Quarter was 2,040.

These results, we think you will agree, speak volumes, for they are very satisfactory, and show our Society is making good headway in spite of all the opposition put in its way. It is only by effort and loyalty that still greater strides may be made.

A comparison of the Balance Sheets for 1900 with 1901 show very gratifying results during the past year.

Three Members have again been nominated who retire from the General Committee, and there being three vacancies the Chairman will declare them re-elected to act for two years.

The output in the Bakery Department during the Quarter has been 26,313 stones, an increase over last Quarter of 1,670 stones, and over last year of 1,104 stones.

We wish you all a very Happy Christmas, and also a Happy and Prosperous Year for 1902.

SHARES ONE POUND EACH, WITHDRAWABLE.

No Member can hold more than 100 shares.

Interest is paid on all paid-up shares at the rate of 5 per cent per annum to purchasing Members, and $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent to non-purchasing Members, in accordance with scale of Rule 40.

Any person wishing to become a Member may do so by applying at the Office of the Society, and paying an entrance fee of 1s., and 6d. for Rules, Books, &c.

When the share or shares are not paid in full on application, Members are expected to allow their dividends to remain until at least one share is fully paid up.

All profits, after paying working expenses, depreciation, and interest on capital, are divided among the purchasers.
