COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

FELLOW-MEMBERS,

Your Committee have pleasure in presenting their Sixty-Fourth Quarterly Report and Balance Sheet. The Sales for the Quarter have been £14,636 5s. 11d., an increase over last Quarter of £1,186. 14s. 4½d., and over corresponding Quarter of last year of £1,496. 11s.

The Profits disposable, after allowing for interest on capital, depreciation, and other contingent expenses, is £1,976. 16s. 10½d., which with the approval of the Quarterly Meeting will be disposed of as follows:—Dividend to Members on £13,594, at 2s. 3d. in the £, £1,529. 6s. 6d.; Dividend to Non-members on £58, at 1s. 1d. in the £, £3. 2s. 10d.; Educational Fund, £21. 7s. 6d.; Bonus to Employés, £18. 16s. 3d.; Plate Glass Insurance, 11s. 9d.; Reserve Fund, £23. 12s. 0½d.; and to carry the balance of £380 forward.

The membership of the Society is now 2,200, an increase this Quarter of 62, and we take this opportunity of thanking our Members for the favour of their continued support during the year. We have endeavoured to act consistently up to the standard we set ourselves of giving good value, attention and diligence to your requirements, and unvarying courtesy in our dealings with you.

In the conduct of so large a business friction may occur from time to time, but we have endeavoured in every case to act fairly and honestly. We are happy to say our efforts have been rewarded by a continuous increase of business. Complaints are welcomed with a view to their immediate remedy. The success of our Bakery Department is very pleasing. The quantity of Bread baked during the Quarter was 30,446 stones, an increase of 1,724 stones over last Quarter, and of 4,132 stones over corresponding Quarter of last year.

We would again remind you that we are in a position to supply Poultry of any kind, either feathered or trussed, and at a fair price. We hope to have a good Christmas trade, and all orders placed with us will be dealt with promptly, and you can rely upon having value for your money.

HOW TO JOIN THE SOCIETY, AND A STATISTICAL STATEMENT SHOWING POSITION OF SOCIETY AT END OF QUARTER, NOVEMBER 8th, 1902.

SHARES ONE POUND EACH, WITHDRAWABLE.

No Member can hold more than 100 shares.

Interest is paid on all paid-up shares at the rate of 5 per cent per annum to purchasing Members, and $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent to non-purchasing Members, in accordance with scale of Rule 40.

Any person wishing to become a Member may do so by applying at the Office of the Society, and paying an entrance fee of 1s., and 6d. for Rules, Books, &c.

When the share or shares are not paid in full on application, Members are expected to allow their dividends to remain until at least one share is fully paid up.

All profits, after paying working expenses, depreciation, and interest on capital, are divided among the purchasers.

NOTICES.

The current Quarter ends on February 7th, 1903.

It is very essential that Members should take notice of the method of conducting business in the Office in relation to Dividends, &c. They will observe that it is very necessary that the rules must be adhered to, and there will be no exception to the following, *i.e.*:—

- No Dividend will be paid unless a Number Ticket is produced, and will only be paid to the Member, or to someone bearing written authority properly written out and duly signed by that Member.
- Our books will be closed for the receiving of contributions and paying of withdrawals during the last week of this Quarter, viz., from February 2nd to February 7th, inclusive.
- All Members making withdrawals must bring their Contribution Books to the Secretary, and withdrawals will only be paid to the Member, or to someone bearing written authority signed by that Member.

A notice of authority to draw Dividend will be found at end of this report, and no Dividend will be paid to anyone other than the Member unless this is produced, properly filled up.

Dividends will be paid from Thursday, December 18th, 1902, to Wednesday, December 24th, 1902, during Office hours; and, in order to facilitate matters, only those who require their Dividends should call.

Members requiring Pass Books must leave them until January 10th, 1903, on which date, or any day following, they may be obtained.

Change and Checks.—All customers are specially requested to examine their change and checks and to see that they are correct before leaving the counter, and also to see that a check is given them by the shopmen for each payment made, however small it may be. It is very important that all customers should give their special attention to this, and thus assist the Committee in making the Check System as complete as possible.

All accounts owing to the Society must be paid at Quarter end, or no Dividend can be allowed.

As business at the Offices is often very congested, the Committee have decided to appoint certain hours for the attendance of callers at the Offices. They have, therefore, appointed the following to be Office Hours, where personal attendance is necessary for the Members to do their business:—
