COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

FELLOW-MEMBERS,

It is our privilege to present to you such a pleasing Statement of Accounts as is herein given.

This issue completes our Twenty-first Year, and the results for the last year add to the record of a continual and successful advance in the Society's business since its commencement.

The Membership of the Society is 3,178.

The Sales for the Quarter are £19,717. 9s. 3d., a decrease on last Quarter of £326. 18s., but an increase on the corresponding Quarter of last year of £1,094. 17s.

The Disposable Balance is £2,406. 9s. 11d., and we propose to use the £286. 12s. 3d. in Dividend and Interest Regulation Fund to enable us to pay a Dividend of 2s. 6d. in the £. The Profits of the Quarter will not allow of so large a Dividend as hitherto, seeing that prices of various commodities have been kept as low as possible. As the season of the year is one of good cheer, we hope by doing this the 2s. 6d. in the £ will be acceptable to the majority of our Members and meet with your approval.

The total for distribution will then be £2,693. 2s. 2d., which we propose shall be divided as follows:—

The Bread Baked, including Currant Bread, has been 40,618 stones, a decrease of 811 stones on last Quarter and an increase of 1,815 stones on the corresponding Quarter of last year.

We regret that we are unable to report much progress in the opening of the new premises. As we stated at the last Quarterly Meeting, we occupied, but, when it came to the testing of some of the machinery it did not prove itself up to the work specified for it to do, and delay has been caused by this having to be rectified.

It is hoped that Members who live near the Shops in the Leys, and those who come in from that side of the town, will do their trade there, and so relieve the pressure and congestion at the Colehill Shops.

It is to be noted that we have decided that all the counter trade done at this Grocery Shop shall be for cash; no credit whatever will be given.

It is pleasing to note that, although the Quarter shows decreased sales in the Boot and Drapery Departments, owing to Cash Trading having been inaugurated, they are increasing again, and we trust will soon surpass what they were before the alteration. Your business upon these lines will then be carried on much more economically and successfully.

REPORT OF CELEBRATION COMMITTEE.

FELLOW-MEMBERS,—It is our great pleasure to now be able to place before you a report of the work in connection with the Coming-of-Age Celebration of your Society.

On March 7th, 1907, the Educational Committee met in conference with the General Committee, and they formed themselves into a Joint Committee to consider the advisability of celebrating the Society's Twenty-first Anniversary.

To do so in some suitable manner was then decided upon, and at subsequent meetings to this *three* Sub-committees were appointed to consider various suggestions.

At the Quarterly Meeting held on March 20th, 1907, the Members were asked to grant from the Disposal of Profit Account the sum of £200 towards the cost, which was agreed to, and it was then also understood that a further sum would be asked for.

The first Sub-committee appointed was composed of four Members, and of these three are among the pioneers of the Society. To them was entrusted an important and arduous task, in that they were asked to compile a history of the Society.

Many and varied were the suggestions considered as a means of best celebrating this occasion, amongst them being a memorial clock, mementos, exhibition, public ball, scholarship, and a demonstration or fête at Tamworth Castle. Whilst these deliberations were going on it came to our knowledge that Tamworth Vicarage was for sale, and it was considered that—as this adjoined the Society's premises—the purchase of the same, if that could be done reasonably, would be a splendid memorial of the Coming-of-Age, and at the same time would be useful to the Society as its business extended. Negotiations were entered into, but from April to September the Celebration Committee were unable to proceed any further until something definite resulted, and ultimately the offers made by the Society were declined.

It now being too late in the season to hold any outdoor demonstration, there were then two more Sub-committees formed—one to consider the presentation to the Members of a souvenir, and the other to consider an opening ceremony of the New Premises.

The latter could not be effected owing to the difficulty of fixing a suitable date, and also the expense in connection therewith, but the result of the former Committee's deliberations was that an Ornamental Caddy, decorated with views of some of the Society's premises and containing a packet of Tea, should be presented to each Member.

Further to the history and the souvenir being presented to our Members, another Sub-committee was formed to consider the best form of a public memorial. This Sub-committee recommended, and it was decided upon: "To present to the Tamworth Hospital an up-to-date air-tight Surgical Cabinet for use in the operating theatre, suitably engraved with the name of the donors and recording the event." We hope that this will be of great use and benefit to the hospital authorities in connection with operations of a serious character.

Now as to the cost. The Surgical Cabinet has been ordered and will cost £25, whilst the Souvenir Tea Caddy, which is also in course of manufacture, will cost (approximately) £260. Not being able to finish the history of the Society until the completion of the twenty-one years, the cost of that can only be roughly estimated. Then there must be added incidental expenses and delivery, so that the Committee ask you to vote a further sum of £300 to the Celebration of the Coming-of-Age Fund.

You sanction is now asked for this sum being taken from the Reserve Fund, and that it be replaced there, as the Profits will allow, within two years.

Hoping this result of our labours will be satisfactory and acceptable to you as a means of celebrating the majority of the Society,
