COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

FELLOW-MEMBERS,

It is our great pleasure to present herewith our 106th Quarterly Balance Sheet and Report for the Quarter ended April 21st, 1913.

The **SALES** for the Quarter amount to £29,048. 12s. 0½d., being an increase over the previous Quarter of £23. 1s. 4½d, and over the corresponding Quarter of last year of £2,988. 10s. 8½d.

The **TRADE PROFITS** for the Quarter are £3,714. 5s. 7½d., an increase over the previous Quarter of £38. 13s. 7½d., and over those of the corresponding Quarter of last year of £220. 18s.

The **BREAD BAKED** numbers 59,510 stones, or 2,395 stones more than the previous Quarter, and 5,508 stones more than during the corresponding Quarter of last year.

The **MEMBERSHIP** is now 4,371, an increase of 86 for the Quarter, and 311 on that of last year.

The **PROFIT DISPOSABLE** is £3,613. 3s. 2½d., and we recommend to you that it be disposed of as follows:—

We have given a deal of consideration to what would be the best alterations to make to the house of No. 8, Colehill, Tamworth, but the deciding as to the departments which could be accommodated there, and the re-arrangement of the others, needs to be thoroughly discussed, and up to the present time we have not come to any definite decision thereon.

A sound and substantial work has been done at the Halford Street Yard. The yard is laid with granite setts on a bed of concrete, the whole width between the bread loading shed and the cart shed, and from the street up to the stables. It can now be kept much more tidy and better for the horses to draw their loads in and out. The contract accepted was £183, and we shall capitalise the cost of this work, paying off through Profit and Loss Account a sufficient sum every Quarter that will enable the whole cost to be paid off in a period of five years.

As was intimated at the last Quarterly Meeting, we have built a suitable Dutch Barn at the Ashlands Farm. This has been desired a very long time, and the opportunity has presented itself to build one and pay off the cost from the Special Farm Expenses Fund.

We have pleasure to state that we have just made an agreement with the Birmingham and District Union of Operatives, whereby we shall pay to our bakers and confectioners a minimum union rate of 28s. for a 54 hours' week.




