

COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

FELLOW-MEMBERS,

We have pleasure in submitting to you the 131st Quarterly Report, together with the Half-yearly Accounts for the period January 13th, 1919, to July 14th, 1919, and hope the same will meet with your approval and support.

THE SALES for the Half Year have been £140,963. 11s. 6d., an increase over the previous Half-Year of £22,487. 2s. 5d., and over the corresponding period of last year of £47,142. 6s. 5d.

THE SURPLUS upon that trade has been £13,227. 4s. 7d.

THE BREAD output has been 133,884 stones, as compared with the previous Half Year of 135,025 stones, a decrease of 1,141 stones, and an increase over the corresponding period of last year of 9,818 stones.

THE MEMBERSHIP is 5,954, an increase upon the last Half Year of 54, and 120 in the Year.

THE MEMBERS' PURCHASES average 20s. 3d. per week.

THE BALANCE DISPOSABLE is £10,012. 12s. 10d., and we recommend to you its disposal as follows —

COAL SUPPLIES are already making our registered members anxious as to whether their position is to be better next winter than that of last year. Knowing what we do, we cannot help feeling more vexation on this question than it would be discreet to express in our report, but will you let it suffice for us to say that the Control of Coal is the same old muddle as the Food Control was in the earlier period of that control. We have had strong representation made to the Coal Controller, and there has been much comparison of figures and arguing, but if promises by the control officials count for anything, we can expect increased supplies this winter. We have taken such measures that if these promises are genuine we shall be able to get those supplies to our members.

DEPARTMENTAL SALES.—We have to specially call your attention to the trade of some of our departments. They are all affected by seasonal trade, but notwithstanding that, there must be no backward trend in sales or service. We specially call to your notice the Drapery, Millinery, Boot and Shoes, Outfitting, Furnishing, and allied trades. We are endeavouring to give you the best of service and reasonable prices, and we confidently expect that you will not be attracted elsewhere before you visit your own shop and see what there is to purchase there.

We have now got many of our old staff back to work, and we are expecting others soon. In the Boot Repairing Department we have plant capacity to do 1,000 pairs of boots per week. Our work and materials are good, and the prices reasonable, so give us your trade.

DELIVERY.—As to delivery service in bread, meat, and milk, we should soon be able to give you special attention and a more frequent and extended delivery. In the past we have been so very much hampered in the strength of the staff and in transport, but when the holiday season is over we shall have a better service of delivery from all departments,

FARM OPERATIONS are going well, and our yield of hay, corn, &c., is up to the average of the district. It was decided at the last Quarterly Meeting to purchase the Poplars Farm, Shuttington (at present 190 acres), which at that time had just been offered to the Society for purchase. This will be completed at Michaelmas. As tenants of this farm for twenty-one years, we know its possibilities, and as there are four more fields to add to it in the purchase, the acreage will be 207. The purchase price is £8,280, or £40 per acre, and the farm is situated on the same road as the Ashlands Farm; the latter farm 1½ miles from the Central Store, and the Poplars 3½ miles. We hope our farming will be successful; convinced that to own the land is the only way to provide for the people.

FOOD CONTROL has to continue, and whilst there is any doubt as to a plentiful supply we share in the opinion of the Food Controller that registration and rationing should be continued. It appears necessary for meat, butter, and sugar, and we hope there will be no hesitation, but that the ration books of our members will be made out with the name of the Society. Since the allocation was based on the number of registered customers, the members have been able to obtain supplies equally as well as any other people outside the Society, and then there is the economy of Co-operative Trade which means a return to the member at the end of the Quarter. There must be nothing done with your cards until our staff visit you to register you as a trader at your own shop.

C.W.S. HEALTH INSURANCE SECTION.—For the convenience of the members of the above Approved Society we have made arrangements with the local agents of The Co-operative Insurance Society Limited to distribute and collect future contribution cards. In addition, the agents will pay all sickness, disablement, and maternity claims, and will generally advise and help members in all their little difficulties. Claims for benefit may be sent either to the office of the Tamworth Industrial Co-operative Society Limited, Colchill, or to the address given below. It is hoped that the improved system of coming to the home to collect and distribute cards and to pay benefits will be appreciated by our members and that they will do all in their power to encourage young people to join the C.W.S. Health Insurance Section upon their attaining the age of 16. Mr. H. WILSON (the principal agent for the Co-operative Insurance Society Limited in this district), of 2, Belgrave Road, Wilnecote, has charge of the work of collecting and distributing contribution cards. He will also be responsible for the payment of benefits. Any member who prefers dealing direct with the Registered Office of the Tamworth Society, without the intervention of the agent, can, of course, continue as at present. It is expected, however, that most members will appreciate the Committee's action in bringing the administration of the Health Insurance to their homes. Mr. H. Wilson will be assisted in his work by Mrs. S. E. Lockwood, 4, Belgrave Road, Wilnecote.

BONUS.—An agreement of wage for the employees is now being arranged, and will come into operation immediately, so that we recommend that all bonuses be merged into wages, a condition which is now recognised and accepted by all the Trade Unions.

FINAL.—In conclusion, we ask your acceptance of the report and accounts presented to you. We feel sure you will agree that the trade shows a successful result, and should be considered in conjunction with the previous Half-year's accounts. For our future trade, we not only appeal to the members for their loyalty of trade, but also to the employees for their loyalty of service, feeling that the amalgamation of interest of the member and employee in their co-operative store are synonymous, and a united determination must be made, not particularly to fight the outside opponent (such opposition slays itself) but to produce and distribute such goods and commodities as are obtainable, everyone sharing in the proprietorship and in its usefulness.

Clothing Club—Easy Payments: Subscriptions to this are received at any time, the amount so received being from 6d. to 5s. All moneys must be expended in the Drapery, Clothing, Boot, Coal, or Furnishing Departments.

Members' Attention is directed to Rule XX., whereby they may nominate the party to whom the money standing to their credit may be paid at their decease. If Members would attend to this rule the money could be transferred at their death free of expense, and those entitled to receive the money saved a considerable amount of trouble.

Small Savings Bank.—Deposits are received at any time during office hours. Sums from One Penny to Ten Shillings may be deposited, but not more than £20 can be on deposit at one time. Interest at the rate of £4. 3s. 4d. per cent per annum is paid on each sum of Four Shillings remaining on deposit for three months.

Members Changing their Address should intimate the same to the Secretary. A Form is placed at the end of this Report for that purpose, and much annoyance will be saved to the staff if we can be advised of any alteration.

Co-operative Insurance.—We are in a position to effect Insurances of all kinds—Life, Fire, Burglary, Live Stock, Accident, and Aircraft and Bombardment. The risk is covered by the Joint Insurance Department of the C.W.S and S.C.W.S., and Co-operators should be convinced of the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance Business.

National Health Insurance.—Under the C.W.S. we are an Approved Section for the purposes of the Insurance under the Act. As in every other business, so in this, we want our Members and their sons and daughters to take their benefit through this Society. We claim to be able to do this business with promptness and with a minimum of expense.

Withdrawals of Share Capital and Dividends can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by such owner of Shares. The Share Pass Book and Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or pay moneys.
