

Committee's Report.

FELLOW-MEMBERS,

We have pleasure in submitting to you the 140th Quarterly Report for your consideration.

The Sales for the Quarter have been £68,545, an increase upon last Quarter of £430, but a decrease upon the corresponding Quarter of last year of £29,243.

The cost of living, according to the Ministry of Labour figures for October, 1920, was 164 per cent above pre-war, while for October, 1921, they stood at 110 per cent. The weekly average of Purchasing Members is 14s. 11d., as against 18s. for last Half Year, and 21s. 10d. for the corresponding Quarter of last year.

Expenses.—Unfortunately the reduced sales have not been accompanied by a corresponding reduction in some of the items of Expenses, namely: Rents, rates, taxes, insurances, postages, gas, electricity, and railway charges.

Membership.—The Membership stands as follows:—

You will observe that there is a decrease upon last Half Year of 157, but we would point out that 204 accounts have had to be cleared, as the holders had ceased to trade. Therefore, the Net Increase would really be 47 for the Quarter.

Bread Output.—The Bread Output for the Quarter was 74,177 stones, a decrease upon the previous Quarter of 7,610 stones, and a decrease upon the corresponding Quarter of last year of 3,854 stones.

We have recently appointed a new Bakery Manager, and we trust there will be no reason for you to take your bread trade away from your own Society, as our loaf is the best.

Interim Dividend.—We recommend an Interim Dividend of 9d. in the £ of sales, and this will be paid in the Baths and Institute on December 8th, 9th, and 10th, 1921.

Oil.—The Oil Lorry is now running on the road, and up to the present a good trade has been done. This should prove a great convenience to Members, and we trust the service will be appreciated by increased trade in that commodity.

Fish.—We have had to make a change in the management of your Fish Department, and we believe, now that it is under good control, you need have no fear in placing orders for all your requirements for Christmas, which will receive the best possible attention, and primest Game and Poultry will be supplied at reasonable prices.

* Shares.—It is gratifying to know that the Share Capital of the Society is being maintained. The amount at the beginning of the Quarter was £147,338. 0s. 8d., and at the end £146,927.

The Small Savings at the beginning was £5,278. 0s. 8d., while at the end it stood at £5,280. 6s. 2d.

When the state of the district regarding unemployment and short time is considered in connection with this, it proves that Members still have confidence in their Society and that it is in a sound and stable condition.

In closing, we express the wish that trade depression will soon lift, and that our Members will then take the opportunity of spending all their money at their own shops, which means they will get the best value always.

Every Member is particularly requested to peruse the following, and their compliance with same is asked for:-

Clothing Club—Easy Payments.—Subscriptions to this are received at any time, the amount so received being from 6d. to 5s. All moneys must be expended in the Drapery, Clothing, Boot, Coal, or Furnishing Departments.

Members' Attention is directed to Rule XX., whereby they may nominate the party to whom the money standing to their credit may be paid at their decease. If Members would attend to this rule the money could be transferred at their death free of expense, and those entitled to receive the money saved a considerable amount of trouble.

Small Savings Bank.—Deposits are received at any time during office hours. Sums from One Penny to Ten Shillings may be deposited, but not more than £20 can be on deposit at one time. Interest at the rate of £4. 3s. 4d. per cent per annum is paid on each sum of Four Shillings remaining on deposit for three months.

Members Changing their Address should intimate the same to the Secretary. A Form is placed at the end of this Report for that purpose, and much annoyance will be saved to the staff if we can be advised of any alteration.

Co-operative Insurance.—We are in a position to effect Insurances of all kinds—Life, Fire, Burglary, Live Stock, and Accident. The risk is covered by the Joint Insurance Department of the C.W.S and S.C.W.S., and Co-operators should be convinced of the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance Business.

National Health Insurance.—Under the C.W.S. we are an Approved Section for the purposes of the Insurance under the Act. As in every other business, so in this, we want our Members and their sons and daughters to take their benefit through this Society. We claim to be able to do this business with promptness and with a minimum of expense.

Withdrawals of Share Capital and Dividends can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by such owner of Shares. The Share Pass Book and Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or pay moneys.

Share, Building (Mortgage), and Penny Bank Books should be sent in regularly on or before dates given on almanac, and the importance of this cannot be too strongly impressed upon Members. When left, the Pass Card should have the amount standing in the Share Book entered thereon and same initialled.

The Current Quarter ends on January 14th, 1922, and Share Books should be sent in by the 6th day of month following.

Dividends will be paid at the Central on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, December 8th, 9th, and 10th, between the hours of 10 a.m. to 12 noon, 2 to 4 p.m., and 6 to 7 p.m. Members are requested to bring their Pass Cards for production at the time of payment.

Children should not be sent to draw Dividends.
