COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

FELLOW-MEMBERS.

We have pleasure in submitting to you the Quarterly Report for the 142nd Quarter ended April 15th, 1922.

THE SALES for the Quarter have been £61,312. 1s. 8d., a decrease upon last Quarter of £4,082. 5s. 10½d., and a decrease upon the corresponding Quarter of last year of £26,690.

THE MEMBERSHIP is as follows:-

THE MEMBERS' PURCHASES equal 12s. 10d. per week, as compared with 14s. 1½d. per week for last Half Year and 18s. 9d. per week for the corresponding Quarter of last year.

THE BREAD OUTPUT is 69,615 stones, as compared with 71,134 stones for last Quarter and 75,984 stones for the corresponding Quarter of last year.

THE PURCHASES by the Society are: From the C.W.S. Limited, 63\(^4\) per cent; Productive Societies, 1\(^4\) per cent; Local Merchants, 10\(^1\) per cent; outside sources, 24 per cent. Your attention must be called to the fact that the whole of our Dairy and Butchery Departments' Purchases, and some of those of the Chemistry, Fish, and Greengrocery Departments, have to be made in the open market from outside traders.

LOANS.—You will see in the recommendations that we ask you to approve the installation of Loans to the Society. This has become necessary because we have a lot of Members' who have the full limit of shares in their Share Account and are desirous of retaining their money in the Society.

SHARES.—It is pleasing to report that the Share and Small Savings Capital has increased during the Quarter; the Shares by £2,210, and the Small Savings by £379. This proves that the Members have confidence in their Society, and we appeal for your further support in capital and trade, being certain that we cannot be beaten for investments, and also goods—taking quality into consideration with the prices paid.

INTERIM DIVIDEND.—We recommend the payment of an Interim Dividend of 9d. in the £ upon purchases, and trust this will meet with your approval.

We regret to have to report the death of two of our employees, Mr. Barnes (the Chemist) and Mr. Pointon (a Bread Deliverer), the former occuring on March 8th, after an operation for appendicitis, and the latter on March 3rd, as the result of an accident. The Society has lost two good servants, and we extend to the wives and relatives of the deceased men our very deepest sympathy in their sad bereavements.

COLLECTIVE ASSURANCE.—We give you the payments made under the Collective Assurance Scheme on page iii. of cover, and have to impress upon Members the necessity for purchasing all their requirements from their own Society and not be led away to outside firms.

It is hoped that the period of depression, unemployment, and bad trade will soon lift and that we shall get back again to normal times.

Clothing Club—Easy Payments.—Subscriptions to this are received at any time, the amount so received being from 6d. to 5s. All moneys must be expended in the Drapery, Clothing, Boot, Coal, or Furnishing Departments.

Members' Attention is directed to Rule XX., whereby they may nominate the party to whom the money standing to their credit may be paid at their decease. If Members would attend to this rule the money could be transferred at their death free of expense, and those entitled to receive the money saved a considerable amount of trouble.

Small Savings Bank.—Deposits are received at any time during office hours. Sums from One Penny to Ten Shillings may be deposited, but not more than £20 can be on deposit at one time. Interest at the rate of £4. 3s. 4d. per cent per annum is paid on each sum of Four Shillings remaining on deposit for three months.

Loans. - Deposits received at any time during office hours. Interest at the rate of £5 per cent per annum.

Members Changing their Address should intimate the same to the Secretary. A Form is placed at the end of this Report for that purpose, and much annoyance will be saved to the staff if we can be advised of any alteration.

Co-operative Insurance.—We are in a position to effect Insurances of all kinds—Life, Fire, Burglary, Live Stock, and Accident. The risk is covered by the Joint Insurance Department of the C.W.S and S.C.W.S., and Co-operators should be convinced of the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance Business.

National Health Insurance.—Under the C.W.S. we are an Approved Section for the purposes of the Insurance under the Act. As in every other business, so in this, we want our Members and their sons and daughters to take their benefit through this Society. We claim to be able to do this business with promptness and with a minimum of expense.

Withdrawals of Share Capital and Dividends can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by such owner of Shares. The Share Pass Book and Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or pay moneys.

Share, Building (Mortgage), and Penny Bank Books should be sent in regularly on or before dates given on almanac, and the importance of this cannot be too strongly impressed upon Members. When left, the Pass Card should have the amount standing in the Share Book entered thereon and same initialled.

The Current Quarter ends on July 15th, 1922, and Share Books should be sent in by the 6th day of month following.
