INTERIM DIVIDEND.—This we recommend to be at 1s. 3d. in the £, and it will be paid out in the Baths and Institute on December 4th, 5th, and 6th.

CHRISTMAS SHOW AND SALE.—We intend holding a Show and Sale at our Central Premises, in the top Furnishing Showroom, commencing December 1st. A good display of useful and fancy presents will be made, and we ask you to call and inspect our goods and make your purchases.

By holding this Bazaar it helps to relieve the congestion in the Drapery and Allied Departments, and we appeal for your support when purchasing your Christmas presents.

BAKERY MACHINERY.—After long and very careful consideration we have decided that the old machinery in our Bakery Department is quite inadequate for getting the best results, and we have decided to install an Automatic Plant, together with two more Drawplate Ovens, from the firm of Joseph Baker and Perkins Limited. Although the expenditure will be large, we feel sure that the results to be obtained by the installation of such a plant will fully justify our spending the money, and by obtaining a more uniform loaf, together with numerous advantages to be got out of an up-to-date plant, we hope to see our Bread Sales increase greatly.

DAIRY DEPARTMENT.—The journeys of this department have been reorganised, with a view to increasing the sale of Milk, and four dandies are at present being used in the nearer journeys. Two ponies and floats are being sold as a result of this.

There are still Members who do not have their Milk from us in the districts into which we deliver, and we trust this alteration will prove to be a success.

ELECTRIC SUPPLY.—We have decided to take our supplies of electric current from the Pooley Hall Colliery supply now brought into the town. The necessary adjustments have been made to enable the existing wring to be used, and we are confident this will prove to be of great benefit to the Society in the future.

QUARTERLY MEETINGS.—The attendance at our Quarterly Meetings is very poor, and we should be pleased to see a much larger attendance there.

By the time this Report reaches you, it will be close upon the Festive Season, and we take this opportunity of extending to each one of you wishes for a Very Happy Christmas and a Bright and Prosperous 1925.






