**BREAD OUTPUT.**—The Bread output for the Quarter was 75,802 stones, this being an increase over the last Quarter of 383 stones, and a decrease on the corresponding period of last year of 1,047 stones.

The new ovens have now been installed and the automatic plant is being proceeded with. This, we trust, will prove to be a great acquisition in our Bakery Department and help us in maintaining a high standard quality of Bread.

**INTERIM DIVIDEND.**—We recommend the payment of an Interim Dividend of 1s. 4d. in the £ on Members' Purchases, and this will be paid out in the Assembly Hall, 5, Colehill, Tamworth, on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, June 4th, 5th, and 6th.

**MEETING ROOM.**—After full consideration we have come to the conclusion that the large room at Colehill should be used for what it was originally intended for, that is a meeting room for the Society's business. This has been fitted out for this purpose, and as those of you who attend the Quarterly Meeting will see, we have a splendid room for all classes of meetings. A music, singing, and dancing licence has been obtained, so that it could be used, if necessary, for other purposes than meetings.

**GROCERY YARD.**—The work on the covering in of the grocery yard at Aldergate is being proceeded with, and there is no doubt but what this will prove to be a great acquisition to that department. The reason for this alteration was fully explained in our last Report.

**DORDON BRANCH.**—We are pleased to report that this branch has now been put in an excellent state both inside and out. The whole of the outside walls have been pointed up. One of the front rooms has been converted into a Butchery Department, and the other one into a Drapery and Sundries Department. We look forward to this branch being a great success in the future, and hope the Members in the vicinity of the shop will do their utmost to make it a grand centre of Co-operative activity.

**FARMS.**—The farming operations of the Society have been exercising our minds to a very great extent, and we believe it to be imperative that we should aim at getting an absolutely clean milk supply. With this end in view we have had the whole of our cattle "tuberculin tested," and are concentrating upon the building up of herds that are absolutely free from tuberculosis.

The veterinary officer who conducts the tests is also engaged to inspect the whole of our live stock, both trades and farms, and to advise as to the best way of it being kept healthy and free from disease.

**IN MEMORIAM.**—It is with the deepest regret that we have to record the death of Mr. Joseph Young on April 12th. He has been employed in our Works Department since its inauguration in 1919, and we always found him to be a loyal and conscientious worker. He was an expert in many branches of the building trade, and is greatly missed. For many years he was a member of the General Committee, and for two years was Chairman of the Society. Our sympathy is extended to Mrs. Young in her great loss.

We thank you for the support you have given to the Society in the past, and ask for your patronage in the future.

**CHRISTMAS CLUB.**—Deposits received at any time in any Department or the Office from January 1st to December 1st. Allowances in goods as follows: For 5s. deposited, goods allowed to 5s. 3d.; for 10s. deposited, goods allowed to 10s. 6d.; for 15s. deposited, goods allowed to 15s. 9d.; for 20s. deposited, goods allowed to 21s. Further particulars given on application.

**CLOTHING CLUB—EASY PAYMENTS.**—Subscriptions to this are received at any time, the amount so received being from 6d. to 5s. All money can be expended in any department.

**MEMBERS' ATTENTION** is directed to Rule XX., whereby they may nominate the party to whom the money standing to their credit may be paid at their decease. If Members would attend to this rule the money could be transferred at their death free of expense, and those entitled to receive the money saved a considerable amount of trouble.

**SMALL SAVINGS BANK.**—Deposits are received at any time during office hours. Sums from 1d. to 10s. may be deposited, but not more than £20 can be on deposit at one time. Interest at the rate of £4. 3s. 4d. per cent per annum is paid on each sum of 4s. remaining on deposit for three months.

**LOANS.**—Deposits received at any time during office hours. Interest at the rate of £4. 10s. per cent per annum.

**MEMBERS CHANGING THEIR ADDRESS** should intimate the same to the Secretary. A Form is placed at the end of this Report for that purpose, and much annoyance will be saved to the staff if we can be advised of any alteration.

**CO-OPERATIVE INSURANCE.**—We are in a position to effect Insurances of all kinds—Life, Fire, Burglary, Live Stock, and Accident.

The risk is covered by the Joint Insurance Department of the C.W.S. and S.C.W.S., and Co-operators should be convinced of the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance business.

**NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.**—Under the C.W.S. we are an Approved Section for the purposes of the Insurance under the Act. As in every other business, so in this, we want our Members and their sons and daughters to take their benefit through this Society. We claim to be able to do this business with promptness and with a minimum of expense.

**WITHDRAWALS** of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by such owner of Shares. The Share Pass Book or Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or pay money.

**SHARE, BUILDING (MORTGAGE), and PENNY BANK BOOKS** should be sent in regularly on or before dates given on almanac, and the importance of this cannot be too strongly impressed upon Members. 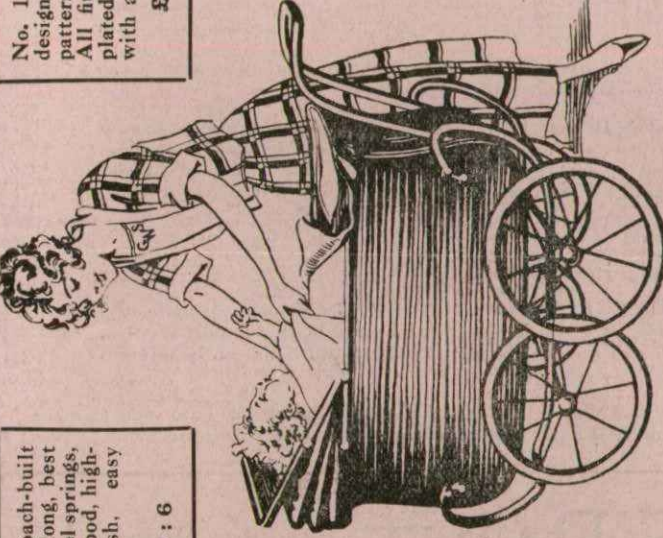
