BAKERY MACHINERY.—The Bakery Machinery is working satisfactorily, and we feel certain that our Bread is the best in the district.

It is hoped that every Member will continue to eat our Hi-Grade Bread. In connection with the launching of the Wrapped Bread Campaign a special house-to-house canvass was made, but, of course, the results of this have not yet fully matured.

At any rate the Society has been brought into every home in this district, and people enlightened as to the benefits to be obtained by trading with our Society.
