We respectfully submit our Report for the 159th Quarter, together with the Accounts for the Half Year ended July 12th, 1926.

The SALES for the Half Year were £134,666. 11s. 4d., as compared with £141,981. 4s. 8d. for the last Half Year, and £137,201. 7s. 8d. for the corresponding period of last year.

It is regrettable that the industrial trouble should have happened, as, unfortunately, it has affected our sales.

We were endeavouring to reach £300,000 this year, but it would appear that this will not now be achieved.

We do appeal, however, for ALL your trade, feeling certain that your money cannot be spent to better advantage elsewhere, taking the quality of our goods and prices charged for same.

PURCHASES.—The purchases by the Society are as follows: From the C.W.S., 72.0 per cent; Local Traders, 8.7 per cent; Productive Societies, 2.2 per cent; and Private Traders, 17.1 per cent. The purchases by departments from the C.W.S. are as follows: Grocery, 81.8 per cent; Outfitting, 51.7 per cent; Drapery, 77.7 per cent; Furnishing, 84.9 per cent; Boots, 63.7 per cent; Millinery, 100 per cent; Boot Repairs, 99.0 per cent; Bakery, 85.9 per cent; Milling, 86.3 per cent; Fish, 12.5 per cent; Butchery, 19.5 per cent; Greengrocery, 3.7 per cent; Dairy, 91.7 per cent; Chemistry, 4.0 per cent; Confectionery Shop, 100 per cent.

MEMBERS' PURCHASES.—These equal 13s. 5½d. per week, as against 14s. 3¼d. per week for last Half Year, and 13s. 9¾d. per week for the corresponding period of last year.

DIVIDEND.—This is at 1s. 4d. in the £, and will be paid out in the Assembly Hall, Colehill, on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, September 2nd, 3rd, and 4th.

VOUCHERS.—You will notice an item of £1,081. ls. 6d. for vouchers in the Assets on page 8. These are vouchers we accepted from the Tamworth Guardians and local Clubs which assisted the miners and their families, and the majority of this money has been repaid.

COLLECTIVE ASSURANCE.—We give the payments made under this scheme on page iii. of cover, and would impress on Members the necessity of purchasing all their requirements from the Society. The payments made are based upon the average purchases made by the Member concerned with the Society.

TWENTY WEEKS' CLUB.—The rules of our Twenty Weeks' Club will be found on page 13. This is an effort to increase the sales of our Drapery and allied departments, and it is hoped members will use this Club to their own benefit, and for the welfare of the Society also.

We trust the period of depression will soon lift, and we shall get back again to normal times.


