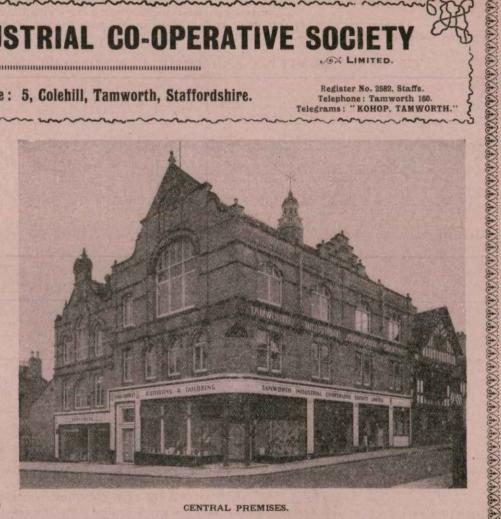

### COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

FELLOW-MEMBERS,

We have pleasure in presenting to you herewith our report for the Quarter ended July 13th, 1936, together with the Accounts for the last Half Year.

TRADE.—The Sales for the Half Year were £162,537, as compared to £156,955 for the previous Half Year, and £153,633 for the corresponding period of last year.

MEMBERSHIP.—At the beginning of the Half Year the membership was 9,873. 407 have been admitted and 175 have left the Society, leaving a net membership of 10,105 on July 13th, 1936.

SHARE CAPITAL.—This has increased by £17,634 during the Half Year; the claims at the end of the balancing period being £268,767, as compared to £251,133 at the beginning of the Half Year.

SMALL SAVINGS.—The claims at July 13th, 1936, amounted to £11,935, as against £10,636 on January 13th, 1936, an increase of £1,299.

LOAN CAPITAL.—Similarly to the Share and Small Savings Capital the Loan Capital has increased during the Half Year. The claims at the end of the balancing period were £76,651, as compared to £71,086 at the beginning of the period under review, this showing an increase of £5,565.

This increase of Capital shows the confidence the Members have in their Society, but on the other hand it is very difficult to find re-investment for our surplus money. This Half Year we have lost £503 on the re-investment of surplus Capital, and in accordance with Rule 40 we give notice that the rate of interest on and from October 12th, 1936, on Share Capital will be 3½ per cent per annum instead of 4 per cent, and on Loan Capital 2½ per cent per annum instead of 3 per cent.

PURCHASES.—During the Half Year the purchases from the C.W.S. were £93,502; from Productive Societies, £4,082; from Private Firms, £10,701; and from Local Traders, £6,669. The percentage rates were:—

The whole of our Milk supplies are now being distributed in bottles with tinfoil caps on, and we hope these meet with your approval. Of course, additional expense has been incurred in the work of bottling, &c., but we look forward to an expansion in our dairy trade to justify the extra cost.

DIVIDEND.—This we recommend to be at the rate of 1s. 6d. in the £, and it will be paid out on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, September 3rd, 4th, and 5th, in the Colchill Assembly Hall.

Bonus Vouchers at 3d. in the £ will also be available on the last Quarter's trading in the Dividend Room.

After Dividend Days these can be obtained from the General Office up to and including Saturday, October 3rd, after which date the issue will cease.

SURPLUS.—The Surplus on the Half Year's trade amounts to £10,334. 3s. 5d., and we recommend its disposal as follows:—

MEMBERS' PURCHASES.—The average per week of Members' purchases equals 12s. 44d. For last Half Year they were 12s. 24d., while for the corresponding Half Year of last year they were 12s. 34d. per week.

Taking the actual purchasing Members the average per week was 14s. 7 d.

GENERAL.—We have had the Butchery cold stores relined during this Half Year, and one of the windows cased in to keep the meat in a clean, cold condition.

While we do a fair trade in this department we feel more could be done by our members, as only the very best of cattle, sheep, and pigs are slaughtered, and every care is taken to ensure the meat being kept in good condition.

The Fish Department needs more trade, and we hope the Members will support it better in the future, also the Confectionery Distributive Department.

In fact there are no limits to the expansion of co-operation in Tamworth and District if only Members will be more co-operative in their thoughts and actions.

Be Co-operative always and show it by a greater amount of purchases from your own Society, and, of course, a greater benefit to yourself by increased savings in the form of Dividend and Bonus.

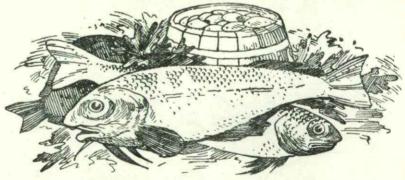

The risk is covered by the Joint Insurance Department of the C.W.S. and S.C.W.S., and Co-operators should be convinced of the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance business.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.—Under the C.W.S. we are an Approved Section for the purposes of the Insurance under the Act. As in every other business, so in this, we want our Members and their sons and daughters to take their benefit through this Society. We claim to be able to do this business with promptness and with a minimum of expense.

WITHDRAWALS of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by such owner of Shares.
