NOTE.—Any Member nominating a candidate without his knowledge or consent is liable to a fine.

No person is eligible to be nominated until he has been a Member of the Society twelve months and shall have no less than one paid-up Share.

No person shall nominate more than one candidate.

No Member of the Committee, or Member who is himself a candidate or an employee, shall be allowed to nominate any Member for this Committee.

Immediately after the close of the Quarterly Meeting a SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING of the Members will be held to consider and adopt an alteration to Rule 23.

RULE 23.—Lines 1 and 2. Delete the words: “The Committee shall consist of twelve members,” and substitute the following:—

“The Committee shall consist of one employee representative, who shall be elected in accordance with the later provisions of this Partial Amendment of Rule, and twelve other members.”

Add the following as a new clause (o):—

“The employee representative on the Committee of Management shall be elected by and from the employees of the Society who are of adult age and who are members of the Society. Such employee shall be nominated and elected by ballot in such form and at such times as the Committee of Management determine, and shall serve for two years and shall be eligible for re-election.

“In the case of death, resignation, or incapacity for service on the Committee, the employees, under the direction of the Secretary, shall proceed to elect a qualified person to the vacancy, who shall serve for the remainder of the time for which the Committee-man causing the vacancy was elected.

“The provisions in Rule 24 relating to the holding of an office or place of profit under the Society, or the acceptance of any permanent situation under the Society, or being concerned in, or participating in, the profits of a contract made with the Society, shall not, in respect of his employment with the Society, apply to the employee representative on the Committee of Management. The employee representative on the Committee shall not speak or vote in connection with any matter in which he has a direct pecuniary interest.”

COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

We have pleasure in presenting to you our report for the last Quarter, which ended on January 9th, 1937, and the Accounts for the last Half Year ending on the same date.

TRADE.—The Sales for the Half Year have been £170,064 as compared to £162,538 for the previous Half Year and £156,955 for the corresponding period of last year.

Unfortunately some of the advance in sales is due to increased prices of commodities brought about by circumstances over which we have no control, but of course a good proportion is brought about by the loyalty of the Members in purchasing from their own Society.

We hope our Sales and Membership will continue to increase and that the ramifications of our Society will be extended, thereby increasing its usefulness to the people of Tamworth and District.

MEMBERSHIP.—At the beginning of the Half Year the membership was 10,105, while on January 9th, 1937, it was 10,372—399 new Members have been admitted and 132 have left or removed from the district.

SHARE CAPITAL.—This has increased by £11,163 on the Half Year, the claims being £279,931 at the end of the Half Year and £268,767 at the beginning of the period under review.

SMALL SAVINGS.—The balance standing to the credit of the Members at the end of the Half Year was £11,931 as against £11,935 at the beginning of the balancing period.

Usually at Christmas time the withdrawals from this fund are heavy and this will in some measure account for the slight decrease only.

LOAN CAPITAL.—This has decreased by £1,857 during the Half Year, no doubt due to the fact of the reduction in interest from 3 per cent per annum to 2½ per cent.

We still believe the rates of Interest offered are high enough compatible with the safety of your Capital and the easy accessibility in case of need.

Higher rates of Interest entail usually more risk for investors and we are content with a fair return for our reinvested Capital. Unfortunately this Half Year we have lost £353. 13s. 11d. on reinvested money.

PURCHASES.—During the Half Year our purchases from the C.W.S. were £180,263; from Private Firms, £11,199; from Productive Societies, £3,866; and from Local Firms, £6,373. The percentage rates were as follows:—

BREAD OUTPUT.—The output of Bread for the Quarter was 74,475 stones as compared to 74,533 stones for last quarter and 75,219 stones for the corresponding period of last year.

DAIRY DEPARTMENT.—The number of gallons of Milk delivered from the Dairy Department for the last quarter were 16,748 of Tuberculin Tested and 22,231 gallons of ordinary milk.

For the previous quarter it was 16,599 gallons of Tuberculin Tested and 19,863 gallons of ordinary milk.

For the corresponding period of last year it equalled 17,776 gallons of Tuberculin Tested and 17,859 of ordinary.

DIVIDEND.—We recommend the payment of a Dividend of 1s. 6d. in the £, to be paid out in the Assembly Hall, Colehill, Tamworth, on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, March 4th, 5th and 6th.

We are not able to recommend the issue of Bonus Vouchers this Quarter on account of the prices of many commodities being cut and not bringing in the usual rates of profit.

SURPLUS.—The Surplus on the Half Year's trade amounts to £9,142. 9s. 4d.

MEMBERS' PURCHASES equal 12s. 7½d. per week. For last Half Year they were 12s. 4½d. per week, and for the corresponding period of last year, 12s. 2½d. per week.

Taking the actual purchasing Members they equalled 15s. 4½d. per week.

GENERAL.—We regret to record a loss on the Farming operations for last year.

Several causes have contributed to this, the bad season for hay, &c., and losses in stock owing to bad weather.

We are endeavouring to remedy these causes with a view to avoiding a repetition in the future.

You will have seen that the Cafe and Milk Bar along with the Furnishing and Carpet Showroom, are nearly completed, and we hope to secure a large share of support from our Members in these departments.




