#### COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

FELLOW-MEMBERS,

We have pleasure in submitting herewith our Report for the last Quarter and the Accounts for the last Half Year, which ended on July 17th, 1939.

TRADE.—The Sales for the Half Year were £180,917, as compared to £179,803 for the previous Half Year and £183,330 for the corresponding period of last year, but this was for 27 weeks.

MEMBERSHIP.—The membership on July 17th, 1939, was 10,981, an increase of 108 over last Half Year, the figures then being 10,873. New Members this period were 367, and removals 259.

SHARE CAPITAL.—The value of Share Capital standing to the credit of Members at the end of the Half Year was £331,334, while at the commencement of the Half Year the value was £321,175, thus showing an increase of £10,159.

SMALL SAVINGS.—The claims in this section at the end of the Half Year were £13,870, while at January 16th, 1939, they equalled £12,699, thus showing an increase of £1,171.

LOAN CAPITAL.—This has increased during the Half Year by £3,756, the amount standing to the credit of the loanholders at the end of the Half Year being £82,888, while at the beginning of the Half Year it was £79,132.

INVESTMENTS.—From the Investments Account you will observe we have reinvested £11,085 of Capital during the Half Year, and the Investments Revenue Account shows a surplus of £117. 16s, 6d.

PURCHASES.—During the Half Year our Purchases from the C.W.S. were £112,719; from Private Firms, £12,649; from Productive Societies, £4,185; and from Local Sources, £2,875. The Departmental Purchases from the C.W.S. were:—

BREAD OUTPUT.—The output of Bread for last Quarter was 72,785 stones. For the previous Quarter it equalled 71,787 stones, while for the corresponding Quarter of last year it was 80,949 stones (14 weeks).

DAIRY DEPARTMENT.—The number of gallons of Milk delivered from the Dairy Department during the last Quarter amounted to 39,767 of Pasteurised and 12,510 of Tuberculin Tested. For the previous Quarter the sales were 37,869 of Pasteurised and 13,752 of Tuberculin Tested, while for the corresponding period of last year (14 weeks) the sales were 35,672 gallons of ordinary Milk and 17,698 gallons of Tuberculin Tested.

Please note the change of time for Saturday; this is occasioned by the Hospital Carnival Procession and the congestion outside the Central Premises during the afternoon.

MEMBERS' PURCHASES.—These equal 12s. 8d. per week on the average. For last Quarter they were 12s. 8\frac{1}{2}d. per week, and for the corresponding Quarter of last year 12s. 7d. per week. Taking the actual purchasing Members the average per week is 15s. 3·3d.

We regret to record the death of Mr. H. Marshall, of the Grocery Department, which occurred on July 17th, 1939. He had worked for the Society for 31 years and was a very respected employee. Our sympathy is extended to his widow and relatives in their loss.

GENERAL.—The question of commencing in the Hairdressing business, as brought forward at the last Quarterly Meeting, has been fully discussed by us, and we cannot recommend the Society to inaugurate such a department at the present time.

As there were only three nominees for three vacancies on the Educational Committee no voting will be necessary.

The new Garage at Colehill and Marmion Street has now been completed. It is a good substantial building, complete with modern fittings, and should prove an acquisition to the Society and be of benefit particularly to the Transport section.

We thank you for the support accorded to the Society in the past, and also to the staffs of our various departments, and trust the Society will continue to receive the same in the future, so that it may expand and prove its usefulness and service to the Members.

If the weekly deposits are not paid to Collectors or Deliverers, they should be paid in the Departments or the Office. As no extra charge is made for the convenience of this Club, it is imperative that subscriptions should be paid weekly and not allowed to accumulate.

MEMBERS' ATTENTION is directed to Rule XX., whereby they may nominate the party to whom the money standing to their credit may be paid at their decease. If Members would attend to this rule the money could be transferred at their death free of expense, and those entitled to receive the money saved a considerable amount of trouble.

SMALL SAVINGS BANK.—Deposits are received at any time during office hours. Sums from 1d. to 10s. may be deposited, but not more than £20 can be on deposit at one time. Interest at the rate of £3 per cent per annum is paid on each sum of 4s. remaining on deposit for three months.

LOANS.—Deposits received at any time during office hours. Interest at the rate of £2. 10s. per cent per annum.

MEMBERS CHANGING THEIR ADDRESS should intimate the same to the Secretary. A Form is placed at the end of this Report for that purpose, and much annoyance will be saved to the staff if we can be advised of any alteration.

HIRE PURCHASE SCHEME.—Goods are let out on Hire Purchase terms from the Furnishing Department. A leaflet giving full details of the scheme may be obtained from that Department.

TWENTY WEEKS CLUB.—We have in operation a Twenty Weeks Club for goods from the Drapery, Millinery, Outfitting, Boots, Chemistry, or Coal Departments. Vouchers of £1 minimum and £5 maximum are issued from the Office, to be repaid at the rate of 1s. per £ per week.

CO-OPERATIVE INSURANCE.—We are in a position to effect Insurances of all kinds—Life, Fire, Burglary, Motor, Live Stock, and Accident. The risk is covered by the Joint Insurance Department of the C.W.S. and S.C.W.S., and Co-operators should be convinced of the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the Office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance business.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.—Under the C.W.S. we are an Approved Section for the purposes of the Insurance under the Act. As in every other business, so in this, we want our Members and their sons and daughters to take their benefit through this Society. We claim to be able to do this business with promptness and with a minimum of expense.

WITHDRAWALS of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by such owner of Shares. The Share Pass Book or Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or to pay money.
