COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

FELLOW-MEMBERS,

Our Report for the last Quarter ending on July 15th, 1940, is presented herewith, together with the Accounts for the last Half Year.

TRADE.—The Sales for the Half Year were £180,471, while for the previous Half Year they were £189,069, and for the corresponding period of last year £180,917.

MEMBERSHIP.—The membership is now 11,168, as compared with 11,044 at the end of the last Half Year, and 10,981 at the end of the corresponding Half Year of last year. Members joining this Half Year were 320, and 196 have withdrawn and left the district.

SHARE CAPITAL.—The value of Members' Share Capital on July 15th, 1940, was £338,981, as compared with £333,500 at the beginning of the Half Year, there being an increase of £5,481.

SMALL SAVINGS.—The claims in this section at the end of the Half Year were £12,885, and £12,670 on January 15th, 1940, thus showing an increase of £215.

LOAN CAPITAL.—There is a slight decrease in Loan Capital of £1,042, the claims at the end of the Half Year being £82,005, and at the beginning of the Half Year £83,047.

INVESTMENTS.—During the Half Year we have made a profit of £150 on reinvested Capital. We had a request from the C.W.S. to withdraw the Special Loan of £1,315 and place it to Ordinary Loan Account, but as we had a slight overdraft we decided to place same to the credit of our Current Bank Account.

PURCHASES.—During the Half Year our Purchases from the C.W.S. were £105,610; from Private Firms, £17,684; from Productive Societies, £4,352; and from Local Sources, £2,628. The percentage of Departmental Purchases from the C.W.S. was as follows:—

BREAD OUTPUT.—The output of Bread for the last Quarter was 74,977 stones, while for the previous Quarter it was 73,121 stones, and for the corresponding period of last year 72,785 stones.

DAIRY DEPARTMENT.—The gallons of Milk sold from the Dairy Department during the last Quarter were 51,440 of Pasteurised and 6,705 of Tuberculin Tested. For the previous Quarter 47,642 gallons of Pasteurised and 7,608 of Tuberculin Tested were sold, and for the corresponding period of last year 39,767 gallons of Pasteurised and 12,510 of Tuberculin Tested were sold.

MEMBERS' PURCHASES.—The average weekly purchase per Member for this Quarter is 12s. 4·3d., and for the last Quarter 11s. 10·2d. For the corresponding period of last year they equalled 12s. 8d. per week. Taking the actual purchasing Members the average is 15s. 4·9d.

HALF-YEARLY MEETINGS.—Owing to the war we have applied to the Chief Registrar for permission to suspend Quarterly Meetings, and through this being done it is necessary to extend the term of office of Committee Members so that their election will take place at the Half-yearly Meetings held in September and March. The Quarterly Meetings of December and June therefore will not be held, but the usual items on the agendas of those meetings will be considered at the Half-yearly Meetings. The present Members of Committee who would have retired in December, 1940, will therefore continue in office until March, 1941.

Nominations for Committee will have to be sent in to the Secretary of the Society not less than eight weeks prior to the holding of the Half-yearly Meetings on forms to be obtained from the Office. Therefore the next nomination forms must be sent in by January 8th, 1941, and voting will be on March 5th, 1941.

DIVIDEND.—This will be paid out at the Central on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, September 5th, 6th, and 7th, between 10 a.m. and 12 noon, 1-30 p.m. and 4 p.m., and 4-30 p.m. to 6 p.m.

GENERAL.—As there were only three nominations for three vacancies on the Educational Committee at the last Quarterly Meeting, no voting is necessary.

MEMBERS' ATTENTION is directed to Rule XX., whereby they may nominate the party to whom the money standing to their credit may be paid at their decease. If Members would attend to this rule the money could be transferred at their death free of expense, and those entitled to receive the money saved a considerable amount of trouble.

SMALL SAVINGS BANK.—Deposits are received at any time during office hours. Sums from 1d. to 10s. may be deposited, but not more than £20 can be on deposit at one time. Interest at the rate of £3 per cent per annum is paid on each sum of 4s. remaining on deposit for three months.

The risk is covered by the Joint Insurance Department of the C.W.S. and S.C.W.S., and Co-operators should be convinced of the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the Office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance business.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.—Under the C.W.S. we are an Approved Section for the purposes of the Insurance under the Act. As in every other business, so in this, we want our Members and their sons and daughters to take their benefit through this Society. We claim to be able to do this business with promptness and with a minimum of expense.

WITHDRAWALS of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by such owner of Shares.
