COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

FELLOW-MEMBERS,

Our report for the last Half Year ended on July 13th, 1942, is presented to you for approval, also the Accounts for the same period.

TRADE.—The Sales for the Half Year were £188,601 as compared to £178,979 for the previous Half Year, and £178,722 for the corresponding period of last year.

We are endeavouring to give a good wartime service notwithstanding the shortage of labour and goods, and the increased work entailed with rationing and coupon control, &c. Those Members who purchase their rationed goods and price-controlled goods still have an additional benefit over those purchased outside the movement, in so far that they receive full dividend on all purchases, even on the amount of Purchase Tax added, and on which no profit is made by the Society.

MEMBERSHIP.—There is a small decrease in the membership of the Society, this being caused to some extent by evacuees who joined the Society when coming to reside in this district, but later returned home again. The membership at the end of the Half Year was 11,597, while at the commencement of the period it was 11,616; 283 persons have joined the Society, and 302 have removed during the period under review.

CAPITAL.—The total value of Share Capital belonging to the Members on July 13th, 1942, was £416,114, this being an increase of £27,567 on the Half Year.

Small Savings capital of £13,617 also showed an increase on last Half Year of £154, while Loan Capital of £106,568 showed an increase of £11,590 on the previous period.

INVESTMENTS.—During the Half Year we have reinvested the sum of £32,000 in the Co-operative Wholesale Society Ltd., at 3 per cent per annum.

Our total reinvested Capital is £504,496, and a small profit of 8s. 6d. was made on all capital reinvested.

PURCHASES.—The Trade purchases for the Half Year were £134,392, being made up of £113,557 from the C.W.S. Ltd., £14,921 from Private Traders, £3,920 from Productive Societies, and £1,994 from local firms.

BREAD OUTPUT.—This was 159,778 stones. For last Half Year it was 168,450 stones, and for the corresponding period of last year 176,577 stones.

DAIRY OUTPUT.—During the Half Year under review 172,283 gallons of Milk were sold.

For the previous period the sales were 170,774 gallons, while for the corresponding period of last year they were 177,893 gallons.

Of course the rationing of supplies of this commodity made a difference in the quantity sold, as much more would have been disposed of in normal times.

MEMBERS' PURCHASES.—The average weekly Member's purchases for this Half Year were 12s. 6\frac{1}{2}d. For last Half Year they were 11s. 10\frac{1}{2}d., while for the corresponding period of last year they were 11s. 11\frac{1}{2}d. Taking the actual purchasing Members they equalled 16s. 1d. per week, as compared to 15s. for last Half Year, and 14s. 9\frac{1}{2}d. for the corresponding period of last year.

GENERAL.

We regret to record the death of Mr. Charles Hopkins, on March 12th, 1942, and also of Mr. William Wilson, on July 16th, 1942.

Mr. Hopkins was employed by the Society for 47 years. During the whole of that time he did the duties assigned to him in a conscientious manner.

He was due for retirement under the Employees' Superannuation Scheme, but unfortunately only lived long enough to receive one week's pension.

Mr. Wilson served on the Educational Committee, being elected in 1931. He took a keen interest in its activities, especially the lending library, and acted as librarian from 1933 until a week before his death.

During that period, by his quiet and unassuming nature, he carried out the duties of librarian in a helpful and kindly manner. He also served for a time on the General Committee.

To the relatives of our deceased friends and co-workers of the movement we tender our sympathy in their loss.

It will be necessary to elect one Member to the Educational Committee in place of Mr. Wilson, at the Half-yearly Meeting on September 2nd, 1942.

Mr. E. Helling: has resigned from the Educational Committee owing to his wartine duties not allowing him to attend the meetings, and it will be necessary to elect another Member in his place.

Mr. Hellings has served for some years on this committee, and has given useful and conscientious service. Our thanks are tendered to him for same.

We extend our best wishes to those employees called away on work of national importance or to H.M. Forces.

Your support of the Society is appreciated, and we trust this will continue in the future.

CO-OPERATIVE INSURANCE .- We are in a position to effect Insurances of all kinds-Life, Fire, Burglary, Motor, Live Stock, and Accident.

The risk is covered by the Joint Insurance Department of the C.W.S. and S.C.W.S., and Co-operators should be convinced of the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the Office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance business.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.-Under the C.W.S. we are an Approved Section for the purposes of the Insurance under the Act. As in every other business, so in this, we want our Members and their sons and daughters to take their benefit through this Society. We claim to be able to do this business with promptness and with a minimum of expense.

WITHDRAWALS of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by such owner of Shares. The Share Pass Book or Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or to pay money.
