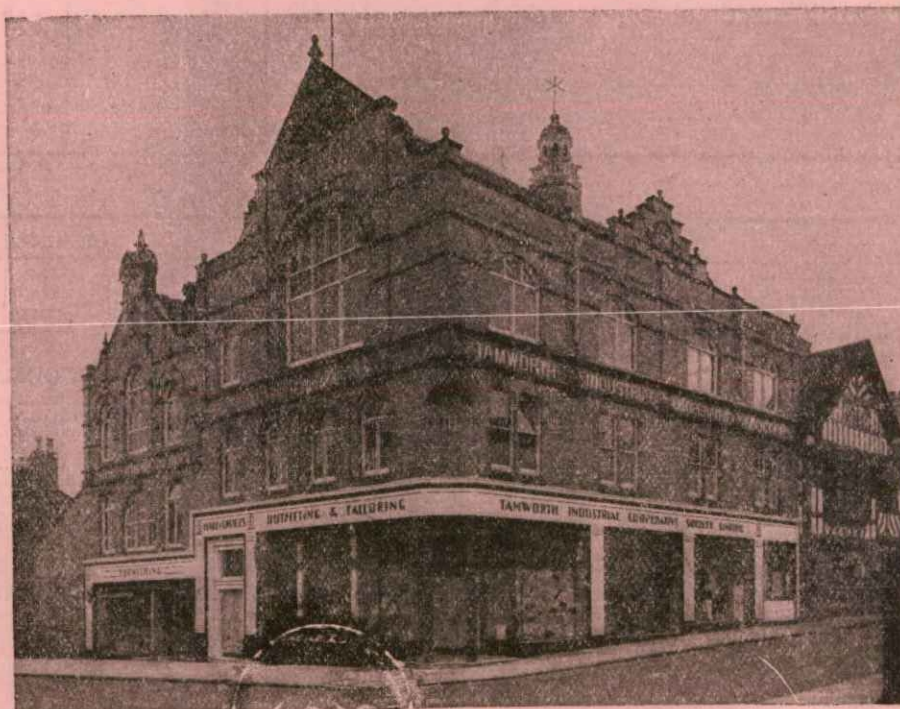

COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

FELLOW-MEMBERS.

We herewith present to you our Report on the last Half Year's operations of the Society for the period which ended on July 12th, 1943, together with the Accounts for the same period, and we trust same will meet with your approval.

TRADE.—The Sales for the Half Year were £192,475, as compared to £193,024 for the last Half Year, and £188,601 for the corresponding period of last year. As you will realise, the trade in the Drapery, Boots, and Outfitting Departments is curtailed by the coupon system operating, but we are endeavouring to give a good service under the existing war-time conditions.

Our Members who purchase their requirements from the Society are securing for themselves and their families the benefit of the Dividend, which is paid on price-controlled goods, and also on the amount added for purchase tax.

MEMBERSHIP.—This is now 11,838. At the commencement of the Half Year it was 11,716. 409 persons have joined the Society, and 287 have left during the Half Year.

CAPITAL.—The value of Share Capital at the end of the Half Year was £503,098, while at the beginning of the balancing period it was £457,901, there being an increase of £45,197.

Small Savings capital was £14,557, this being an increase of £394 on the Half Year, while Loan Capital on July 10th stood at £132,522, as compared to £116,614 at the beginning of the Half Year, showing an increase of £15,908.

INVESTMENTS.—During the Half Year we have invested the sum of £56,000 (see details of the separate investments appearing in the Investments Account.) A small loss of £376 has been made on reinvested Capital this Half Year.

PURCHASES.—These were £136,577 for the Half Year, made up of £115,749 from the C.W.S. Ltd., or 84.8 per cent; £15,312 from private traders, equalling 11.2 per cent; £2,973 from Productive Societies, or 2.2 per cent; and £2,543 from local sources, or 1.8 per cent.

BREAD OUTPUT.—This was 169,767 stones; for last Half Year it was 164,503 stones; and for the corresponding period of last year, 159,778 stones.

DAIRY SALES.—We have sold 169,569 gallons of Milk during the Half Year, as against 169,507 gallons for the last Half Year and 172,283 gallons for the corresponding period of last year.

MEMBERS' PURCHASES.—These average 12s. 6d. per week. For the last period they were 12s. 8d., and for the corresponding period of last year, 12s. 6d. Taking the actual purchasing Members the average was 14s. 10d., as compared with 16s. 9d. for the previous period and 16s. 1d. for the corresponding period of last year.

DIVIDEND AND BONUS.—This will be paid out at the Central Premises on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, September 2nd, 3rd, and 4th, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 noon, 1-30 to 4 p.m., and 4-30 to 6 p.m.

GENERAL.—Mr. E. Gallop, one of the nominees for a vacancy on the Educational Committee at the last Half-yearly meeting, has left the district and does not wish his nomination to stand. As there are only three other nominations for three vacancies it will not be necessary for voting to take place.

No. 2 BRANCH.—On June 24th we opened a branch at Amington at the address known as The Old Parsonage, under the management of Mr. Harold Sketchley who has been employed by the Society for many years.

Mr. Sketchley served at Dordon Branch for a long period, and we feel confident he will look after the interests of the members in the Amington district.

NATIONAL SAVINGS.—We are Honorary Official Agents for the sale of War Saving Certificates and Saving Stamps and hold a stock of these in various denominations ready for issue upon application at the General Office to the Cashier.

We are agents for the Co-operative Permanent Building Society, who have made a special allocation of their funds for the purpose of granting advances to Owner Occupiers at a rate of interest of 4 per cent per annum upon a maximum repayment term of 30 years.

These terms have been devised to meet the special war circumstances now prevailing and will help to alleviate pressing housing problems.

Further particulars can be obtained by application at the General Office of the Society.

We regret to record the death of the following, and extend to the relatives our deepest sympathy in their bereavement:—

MR. STANLEY CARTER, killed in action in Burma, March 16th, 1943. He was employed in the Furnishing Department from 1932 to 1940, prior to serving in H.M. Forces.

MR. DAVID TWIGG, died March 21st, 1943. He was employed in Bakery Department from 1915 and later transferred to Delivery and Stables Department.

MR. GEO. H. ANDREWS, killed in action in North Africa, June 27th, 1943. He was employed in the Grocery Department from 1937 until June, 1940, when he left for military service.

MR. ALFRED WITTRICK, died July 19th, 1943. He was employed as a carpenter and joiner in the Works Department since 1928, until he retired on pension on account of ill health.

MR. WILLIAM JACKSON, died July 27th, 1943. He was one of the pioneers of the Society and served on the General Committee for many years. A strong advocate of Co-operation, he did much to promote the activities and welfare of our Society.

MR. WALTER WAGSTAFF, of the Delivery Department, was reported as missing for a long period, but in June, 1943, news was received that he was a prisoner of war in Japanese hands. We were glad to know he had been traced, and trust that he will be allowed to return home again as soon as possible.

We extend our best wishes to those employees serving in H.M. Forces and on work of national importance.

CHRISTMAS CLUB.—Deposits received at any time in any Department or the Office from January 1st to December 1st. Allowances in goods as follows: For 5s. deposited, goods allowed to 5s. 3d.; for 10s. deposited, goods allowed to 10s. 6d.; for 15s. deposited, goods allowed to 15s. 9d.; for 20s. deposited, goods allowed to 21s. Further particulars given on application.

MEMBERS' ATTENTION is directed to Rule XX., whereby they may nominate the party to whom the money standing to their credit may be paid at their decease. If Members would attend to this rule the money could be transferred at their death free of expense, and those entitled to receive the money saved a considerable amount of trouble.

SMALL SAVINGS BANK.—Deposits are received at any time during office hours. Sums from 1d. to 10s. may be deposited, but not more than £20 can be on deposit at one time. Interest at the rate of £3 per cent per annum is paid on each sum of 4s. remaining on deposit for three months.

LOANS.—Deposits received at any time during office hours. Interest at the rate of £2. 10s. per cent per annum.

MEMBERS CHANGING THEIR ADDRESS should intimate the same to the Secretary. A Form is placed at the end of this Report for that purpose, and much annoyance will be saved to the staff if we can be advised of any alteration.

HIRE PURCHASE SCHEME.—Goods are let out on Hire Purchase terms from the Furnishing Department. A leaflet giving full details of the scheme may be obtained from that Department.

TWENTY WEEKS' CLUB.—We have in operation a Twenty Weeks' Club for goods from the Drapery, Millinery, Outfitting, Boots, Chemistry, or Coal Departments. Vouchers of £1 minimum and £5 maximum are issued from the Office, to be repaid at the rate of 1s. per £ per week.

CO-OPERATIVE INSURANCE.—We are in a position to effect Insurances of all kinds—Life, Fire, Burglary, Motor, Live Stock, and Accident.

The risk is covered by the Joint Insurance Department of the C.W.S. and S.C.W.S., and Co-operators should be convinced of the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the Office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance business.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.—Under the C.W.S. we are an Approved Section for the purposes of the Insurance under the Act. As in every other business, so in this, we want our Members and their sons and daughters to take their benefit through this Society. We claim to be able to do this business with promptness and with a minimum of expense.

WITHDRAWALS of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by such owner of Shares. The Share Pass Book or Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or to pay money.

SHARE and SMALL SAVINGS BOOKS should be sent in regularly to be made up and audited, and the importance of this cannot be too strongly impressed upon Members. When left, the Pass Card should have the amount standing in the Share Book entered thereon and same initialled.
