## COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

We have pleasure in presenting to you herewith our Report on the last Half Year's operations of the Society, together with the audited printed Accounts for your approval.

TRADE.—The Sales for the Half Year ended July 16th were £223,184, as compared with £221,372 for the last Half Year, and £215,876 for the corresponding period of last year.

MEMBERSHIP.—This, at the end of the Half Year, is 12,298. During the Half Year 358 have joined, and 245 have withdrawn or left the district.

CAPITAL.—The value of the Share Capital on July 16th was £642,717, as against £618,922 at the beginning of the Half Year, an increase of £23,795.

Small Savings capital is £15,515 as compared with £15,443 at the beginning of the period.

Loan Capital on July 16th was £207,319, while at the beginning of the Half Year it was £183,095, there being an increase of £24,224.

As previously reported we had to reduce the rates of interest paid on Share Capital on account of the loss sustained by re-investment.

This Half Year, however, we have been able to make a profit of £120 on the Investments Revenue Account.

You will notice that we have invested £325 in shares in the C.W.S. at 3½ per cent per annum, and £40,000 in the National War Bonds at 3 per cent per annum.

PURCHASES.—The Trade Purchases were £156,612, made up of £132,066 from the C.W.S. Ltd., or 84·3 per cent; £19,321 from private firms, or 12·3 per cent; £1,981 from Productive Societies equal to 1·3 per cent; and £3,244 from local sources equal to 2·1 per cent.

BREAD OUTPUT.—This was 174,625 stones for the Half Year, as compared with 174,115 stones for the last Half Year. For the corresponding period of last year (27 weeks) it was 175,939 stones.

DAIRY SALES.—During the period under review we have sold 210,930 gallons of milk from the Dairy Department. For the last Half Year the Sales were 193,065 gallons.

For the corresponding period of last year the sales were 201,471 gallons (27 weeks).

MEMBERS' PURCHASES.—These average 13s. 9d. per week. For last Half Year it was 13s. 11½d. per week, and for the corresponding period of last year they equalled 13s. 3½d. per week.

Actual trading Members' Purchases this Half Year were 16s. 2\(\frac{3}{4}\)d. per week, while for last Half Year they were 16s. 2\(\frac{3}{4}\)d. per week, and for the corresponding period of last year 15s. 5\(\frac{1}{4}\)d. per week.

GENERAL .-

We deeply regret to hear of the death of Roy George Whitehouse, who was killed in action in North-West Europe, on October 10th, 1944. He was employed in our Dairy Department as a milk deliverer, and during the period of service with the Society (September 1935, to September, 1939) rendered conscientious and good work. We offer to his widow and relatives our profound sympathy in their loss.

We have not yet been successful in obtaining many of our permanent staff from the forces, but possibly during the next few months they will return and take up work for the Society.

It will be strange at first to be confined in the department they left, but we trust they will soon settle down to civilian life and that their service to the movement will prove to be a successful one. Our best thanks are due to the permanent and temporary war-time staffs for the way they have assisted in carrying on the Society through the difficult years of the war.

Supplies of many commodities are still in very short supply such as canned meats, biscuits, and other points goods, but our departmental managers endeavour to distribute them as fairly as possible.

Many economies can be effected by trading at your own Society, particularly with fixed price controls in bread, meat, milk, and other articles in everyday use, and loyal purchasing Members are reaping the benefit of the Dividend received,

With renewed thanks to you for your support during the past, and trusting to receive a continuation of same in the future.

The time is not opportune at the moment for full development of the services we have in mind, but we shall continue to study your interests to the best of our ability.

CHRISTMAS CLUB.—Deposits received at any time in any Department or the Office from January 1st to December 1st. Allowances in goods as follows: For 5s. deposited, goods allowed to 5s. 3d.; for 10s. deposited, goods allowed to 10s. 6d.; for 15s. deposited, goods allowed to 15s. 9d.; for 20s. deposited, goods allowed to 21s. The risk is covered by the Joint Insurance Department of the C.W.S. and S.C.W.S., and Co-operators should be convinced of the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the Office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance business.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.—Under the C.W.S. we are an Approved Section for the purposes of the Insurance under the Act. As in every other business, so in this, we want our Members and their sons and daughters to take their benefit through this Society. We claim to be able to do this business with promptness and with a minimum of expense.

WITHDRAWALS of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by such owner of Shares.
