COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

FELLOW-MEMBERS,

Our Report on the activities of the Society is presented herewith together with the audited Accounts for the last Half Year.

TRADE.—The Sales for the period under review were £229,625, as compared to £223,184 for the previous Half Year and £221,372 for the corresponding period of last year.

MEMBERSHIP.—This was 12,488 on January 14th, 1946, whilst on July 16th, 1945, it stood at 12,298. During the Half Year 338 have joined and 148 have withdrawn and left the district.

CAPITAL.—The value of the Share Capital at the end of the balancing period was £654,591 as compared to £642,717 at the beginning, thus showing an increase of £11,874. Small Savings claims show a slight decrease from £15,516 in July, 1945, to £15,109 at the end of this Half Year. Loan Capital continues to increase, the value of same at the end of this Half Year being £223,196, as compared to £207,319 in July, 1945, the increase being £15,877. On the re-invested capital this Half Year we have been successful in making a small profit of £479. From time to time we have to seriously consider making investments by withdrawals from the Current Banking Account, and during this period £28,780 has been so transferred (for details see Investments Account).

PURCHASES.—The Trade Purchases were £176,890, made up of £150,554 from the C.W.S. Ltd., or 85·1 per cent; £19,956 from private firms, or 11·3 per cent; £2,804 from Productive Societies, or 1·6 per cent; and £3,576, from local sources, or 2·0 per cent.

BREAD OUTPUT.—This was 185,310 stones during the Half Year. For last Half Year it was 174,625 stones, while for the corresponding period of last Year, it was 174,115 stones.

DAIRY SALES.—For the period ending January 14th, 1946, the sales of Milk were 201,274 gallons. For the previous Half Year they were 210,930 gallons, while for the corresponding period of last year 193,065 gallons of milk were sold.

MEMBERS' PURCHASES.—These averaged 14s. 1½d. per week. For last Half Year they were 13s. 9d. per week, and for the corresponding period of last Year, 13s. 11½d. per week. Actual Trading Members' purchases this Half Year were 16s. 6½d., as compared to 16s. 2½d. per week for the last Half Year, and 16s. 2½d. per week for the corresponding period of last Year.

GENERAL .-

We deeply regret to hear of the death of the following:-

Mr. John Wm. Longden, on October 21st, 1945; Miss Eilleen King, on October 23rd, 1945; Mr. W. Wagstaffe, on September 29th, 1944; Mr. E. Hall, on December 13th, 1945;

Mr. Longden was one of the Pioneers of our Society, being Chairman of the General Committee in the years 1893 and 1903, and gave much assistance in the early days to place the Society in a sound position.

Miss King was an assistant in the Furniture and Hardware Department from October, 1941, until her unfortunate illness.

Mr. Wagstaffe was employed in the Delivery Department when he left to join H.M. Forces in June, 1940. He had been employed since April, 1930.

Mr. Hall was employed in the Grocery Department from August, 1931, until his lamented death in December, 1945, with the exception of his period of Military Service. All were good employees. We offer our profound sympathy to the widows and other relatives of the above-mentioned in their loss.

Mr. John Davis has intimated his intention of retiring from the General Committee from the Half-Yearly Meeting in March, 1946. He has served since Sept., 1921, and prior to this was a member of the Educational Committee. For a long period he was the Chairman of the Finance Sub-Committee and throughout the whole period has given very good and conscientious service to the Society. His wise counsel and experience will be missed, but we are grateful to him for the splendid service he has rendered. We have had placed on record in the minutes of the General Committee meetings an appreciation of his service. We regret his continued indisposition, but trust this will not be of long duration and that he will be able to enjoy his well-deserved retirement.

This is our first Report since the end of the war. Already some of our employees have returned to the service of the Society. We welcome them and trust they will soon settle down to peace-time conditions.

Our thanks are tendered to those temporary war-time employees who have rendered such useful service in the absence of those in H.M. Forces, &c., also to those of the permanent staff.

We pay our tribute to those who unfortunately will not return, having sacrificed their lives so that we who are left behind may live in peace and security.

Your Society will gradually emerge from wartime conditions. It has a big part to play in building better social conditions. Through the Co-operative Societies millions of people become partners and owners of the vital trades and services which provide everyday needs. Let your resolution be to support your own Society as far as possible both as a purchaser and by active work as a Member.

A strong, live, and vigorous Co-operative Movement can play an enormous part in overcoming the difficulties that now beset us. The future will bring increased costs owing to the return of male staff with, unfortunately, no greater quantity of goods available for sale owing to the necessity for continued rationing. It is anticipated, therefore, that overhead costs will increase, thus reducing the surplusses available for distribution.
