#### COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

FELLOW-MEMBERS,

We have pleasure in presenting to you our Report on the activities of the Society for the last Half Year, which ended on January 13th, 1947, together with the audited Accounts.

TRADE.—The Sales for the Half Year were £267,442, as compared to £246,793 for the previous Half Year and £229,625 for the corresponding period of last year.

MEMBERSHIP.—This is now 13,077. At the beginning of the Half Year it was 12,794, 420 persons having joined and 137 having withdrawn, the majority of these leaving the district.

CAPITAL.—The value of the Share Capital at the end of the Half Year was £675,608, as against £668,134 on July 15th, 1946, and £654,591 on January 14th, 1946.

Small Savings Claims stand at £13,377, a decrease of £555 on the balances at the beginning of the period.

Loan Capital stands at £279,881, while at the beginning of the Half Year it

equalled £256,569, and for the corresponding period it was £223,196.

On the re-invested capital this Half Year we have made a profit of £715, but it is becoming increasingly difficult to re-invest our capital at a profit to the Society. We have invested £1,245 this Half Year.

PURCHASES.—The trade purchases made during this period were £210,601, made up of £172,971 from the C.W.S. Ltd., or 82·1 per cent; £29,602 from private firms, or 14·1 per cent; £3,623 from Productive Societies, or 1·7 per cent; and £4,405 from local sources, or 2·1 per cent.

BREAD OUTPUT.—During the Half Year this was 202,098 stones (14lb. each). For the last Half Year it was 183,325 stones, and for the corresponding period of last year it was 185,310 stones (16lb. each).

DAIRY SALES.—The sales of Milk for the Half Year were 197,001 gallons. For the last Half year they were 220,691 gallons. For the corresponding period of last year they equalled 201,274 gallons.

MEMBERS' PURCHASES.—This averaged 15s, 8\frac{3}{4}d. per week. For last Half Year they were 14s, 10d. per week, while for the corresponding period of last year they were 14s, 1\frac{1}{2}d. per week. The actual trading Members this Half Year were 11,185, and their average purchases were 18s, 4\frac{3}{4}d. per week, last Half Year 17s, 3d. per week, last Year 16s, 6\frac{3}{4}d. per week.

DIVIDEND.—This will be paid out at the Central Premises as usual on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, March 6th, 7th, and 8th, between 10 a.m. to 12 noon, 1-30 p.m. to 4 p.m., and 4-30 p.m. to 6 p.m.

GENERAL.—Mr. L. Harper resigned from the General Committee on January 22nd, and it will be necessary to fill the vacancy created according to Rule 23(f). Mr. Harper was first elected to serve on the General Committee in

December, 1930. He has served on the various Sub-committees of the Society, and was Chairman for a period. During his long association with the Committee he has given valuable assistance by his able and conscientious service, and it is regretted that he has terminated his association on the Board.

Mr. F. Willis has been appointed Manager of our Butchery Department in succession to Mr. A. E. Young (retired). Mr. Willis has been employed by the Society for many years, and it will be his endeavour to further the sales of the department and to give the best possible assistance to our Members.

Mr. Beeson is the new Manager of our Boot and Shoe Department to succeed Mr. Hessian, who has retired. Mr. Beeson came from the Birmingham Society with the highest of references, and he is doing all he possibly can to obtain the goods applicable to his department.

Mr. Lucas is the Manager of our Works and Funeral Furnishing Department. He succeeds Mr. E. Blood, who has retired. He came to us from the Crewe Society with excellent records of service, and he and his department are trying hard to retain and to continue to merit the confidence of our Members. We have received many letters of commendation for the efficient and reverent way the funerals are being conducted.

Mr. S. Chapman has been appointed to succeed Mr. W. Walton as Transport Manager. He has been with the Society from a boy, and we feel sure will be successful in carrying out this important post in the service of the Society.

Mr. J. Cooke, the Horsekeeper, retired on pension on November 7th. We hope he will have a long and healthy period in which to spend his leisure time. He served the Society in this capacity for 12 years, and rendered useful service. Mr. W. Sigley, of the Bakery Department, retired on pension on February 20th. He has served the Society faithfully for the long period of 31½ years. We trust he will enjoy the best of health and a long and happy retirement.

We regret the passing of Miss Helen Bennett on August 22nd, 1946, after a long illness. See commenced in the Office on April 25th, 1911, and served for a long period as counter clerk. She was much appreciated by the Members for her genial disposition and efficiency.

Mr. Henry Ward died on November 6th, 1946, at the age of 84 years. He was appointed in the Butchery Department in December, 1889, and atthough leaving for a short period, returned and took control of the department, holding the position until his retirement in 1929.

To their relatives we extend our deepest sympathy in their loss.

The Welcome Home Joint Committee have now disbursed the fund which was created to make a gift to the employees who served in H.M. Forces upon their return to the service of the Society—a sum of £1,180 was distributed. Each received £10, and a small balance in the fund was paid over equally to the next-of-kin of those who paid the supreme sacrifice in addition to the £10. It is desired to thank those Members who supported the fund by trading in the Share Number 2001, the Dividend from this source amounting to £132, 12s. 5d.

We decided some little time ago to convert rooms at the Leys premises into an up-to-date Confectionery Productive Department, and the necessary licence to carry out the scheme was obtained. Some progress has been made, and we trust in a few months' time we shall be able to commence production, and the Bakery Department will then be utilised for making bread only.

A negotiated agreement between the Trade Union and the Co-operative Societies became operative on October 14th which provided for an increase in the basic rates of wages and a reduction of hours. Our wages for this Half Year have increased considerably in consequence of this, and also by the return to our employ of the men after service in H.M. Forces. This increase, together with a general increase in other items of expenditure, will have the effect of reducing the rates of Dividend in the near future.

To perpetuate the memory of those employees who fell in the war we have decided to grant three scholarships annually. There will be one for Members, one for senior employees, and one for junior employees. They will be for one week at a Co-operative Union Summer School each year, all expenses paid, and to participate in the scheme essays will have to be submitted. The details will be advertised in the Home Magazine in due course.

We extend to you our continued thanks for the support given to the Society and also to the members of the staff.

CHRISTMAS CLUB.—Deposits received at any time in any Department or the Office from January 1st to December 1st. Allowances in goods as follows: For 5s. deposited, goods allowed to 5s. 3d.; for 10s. deposited, goods allowed to 10s. 6d.; for 15s. deposited, goods allowed to 15s. 9d.; for 20s. deposited, goods allowed to 21s. Further particulars given on application.

MEMBERS' ATTENTION is directed to Rule XX., whereby they may nominate the party to whom the money standing to their credit may be paid at their decease. If Members would attend to this rule the money could be transferred at their death free of expense, and those entitled to receive the money saved a considerable amount of trouble.

SMALL SAVINGS BANK.—Deposits are received at any time during office hours. Sums from 1d. to 10s. may be deposited, but not more than £20 can be on deposit at one time. Interest at the rate of £3 per cent per annum is paid on each sum of 4s. remaining on deposit for three months.

The risk is covered by the Joint Insurance Department of the C.W.S. and S.C.W.S., and Co-operators should be convinced of the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the Office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance business.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.—Under the C.W.S. we are an Approved Section for the purposes of the Insurance under the Act. As in every other business, so in this, we want our Members and their sons and daughters to take their benefit through this Society. We claim to be able to do this business with promptness and with a minimum of expense.

WITHDRAWALS of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by such owner of Shares. The Share Pass Book or Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or to pay money.
