COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN.

We have pleasure in presenting herewith our report on the activities of your Society during the last Half Year, which ended on July 12th, 1948, together with the audited accounts relating thereto.

TRADE.—The Sales for the Half Year were £307,143, as compared to £297,434 for the previous Half Year, and £268,836 for the corresponding period of last year.

MEMBERSHIP.—This is now 13,545. During the Half Year, 316 have joined the Society and 222 have withdrawn or left the district.

CAPITAL.—The value of Share Capital on July 12th, 1948, was £668,543, while at the beginning of the period it was £677,770. The deposits have been very much less than in the previous period which has its effect on the final balance as stated. The Society has plenty of capital at the moment as it is difficult to employ the same for the purposes of trade until prices of property, &c., become more reasonable.

Small Savings claims stand at £12,586, as compared to £12,387 at the beginning of the period.

Loan Capital is £371,910, as compared to £329,306 on January 12th 1948. On the re-invested capital a small loss of £15 has been made. This was caused by a reduction in Interest received on Loan Investments. The whole question of re-invested capital will be carefully watched by the Finance Sub-Committee

PURCHASES.—The trade purchases were £223,943, made up of £172,161 from the C.W.S. Ltd., or 76.9 per cent; £44,012 from Private Traders, or 19.7 per cent; £4,058 from Productive Societies, or 1.8 per cent; and £3,712 from local sources equalling 1.6 per cent. The average purchases from the C.W.S. were:—

BREAD OUTPUT.—During the Half Year the output of Bread was 219,683 stones. For the last Half Year it equalled 215,351 stones, and for the corresponding period of last year it was 209,598 stones.

Mr. Housden left our employ as Bakery Manager on March 6th, 1948, having secured an appointment as Manager of the Leicester Society's Bakery Department.

DAIRY SALES.—The Sales of Milk during the period under review were 246,255 gallons. For the last half year they were 205,990 gallons and for the corresponding period of last year 225,592 gallons. As you know, these sales are regulated by the amount of the weekly ration as allowed by the Ministry of Food.

MEMBERS' PURCHASES.—These averaged 17s. 5¼d, per week. Last Half Year they were 17s. per week and for the corresponding period of last year they were 15s. 6¼d, per week.

The actual trading Members were 11,818, and their average weekly purchases were 20s. as compared to 19s. 5\(\frac{1}{2}\)d. for the last half year and 18s. for the corresponding period of last year.

GENERAL .-

We regret the passing of Mr. W. Archer of the Delivery Department on March 16th, 1948, and of Mr. C. W. Day, the Manager of our Greengrocery Department, on May 10th.

Mr. Archer commenced with the Society on February 12th, 1912, and Mr. Day on July 26th, 1919. Both these employees had to endure long and painful illnesses and we extend to their relatives heartfelt sympathy in their loss.

The Branch at Wilnecote was opened on Friday, April 23rd, by Mr. Pittam of Burton-on-Trent, who is the Secretary of the Stafford District Council of the Co-operative Union Limited and the trade is proving satisfactory to us. We trust the branch is helpful to the Members in the locality.

On April 26th, in common with many other Societies, we supported the action of the National Authority of the Co-operative Union Limited in assisting the Government by a price reduction policy when Bread, Bacon, Cheese, Butter, Margarine, Sugar, and Preserves were reduced in price to our Members. This had the effect of a reduction of surplus in the Bakery and Grocery Departments.

On July 5th a revised wages agreement was operated, this having an effect on the surplus of the departments concerned, but as only one week is charged in this half-year's accounts, the full effect of the cost has not been felt yet.

We thank you for your continued support given to the Society and also the staffs of the various departments for their co-operation.
