COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN.

We have pleasure in submitting to you for approval our report on the activities of the Society for the last Half Year, which was for 27 weeks, together with the audited accounts which cover the period from January 11th to July 16th, 1949.

TRADE.—The Sales for the Half Year were £351,008 (27 weeks). For the last Half Year they were £335,484 (26 weeks), while for the corresponding period of last year they were £307,143 (26 weeks).

MEMBERSHIP.—This is now 13,861. During the Half Year 294 have joined and 172 have left—most of these leaving the district.

CAPITAL.—The value of Share Capital at the end of the Half Year was £651,649, while at the beginning of the period it was £656,446, thus showing a reduction of £4.797.

SMALL SAVINGS claims are £11,696, as against £11,410 on January 10th, 1949.

LOAN CAPITAL is £425,461, while on January 10th, 1949, it was £385,078, thus showing an increase of £40,383.

On the reinvested capital a surplus of £639 has been made.

PURCHASES.—The trade purchases were £261,154, made up of £199,459 from the C.W.S., or 76·3 per cent. £51,098 from Private Trade, or 19·6 per cent. £4,314 from Local Traders, or 1·7 per cent, and £6,283 from the Productive Societies, or 2·4 per cent.

BREAD OUTPUT,—During the Half Year the production of Bread was 240,539 stones. For the last Half Year it was 234,677 stones, and for the corresponding period of last year it was 219,683 stones.

DAIRY SALES.—The Sales of Milk for this Half Year were 292,500 gallons. For the last Half Year they were 248,133 gallons and for the corresponding period of last year 246,255 gallons.

MEMBERS' PURCHASES.—These average 18s. 9d. per week for this period and 18s. 9½d. per week for the last Half Year, while for the corresponding period of last year they were 17s. 5½d. per week. The actual trading membership was 12,016 and the average per week of their purchases was £1. Is. 7½d. as against £1. Is. 7½d. for the last Half Year and £1 per week for the corresponding period of last year.

SURPLUS DISPOSABLE.—This is £16,978. 3s. 8d. We recommend it be allocated as follows:—

DIVIDEND.—This will be paid out as usual in the Assembly Hall, 5, Colehill, Tamworth, on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, September 8th, 9th, and 10th, between 10 a.m. and 12 noon, and 1-30 to 4 and 4-30 to 6 p.m. Dividend not withdrawn at these times is added to Share Accounts.

GENERAL.—A further instalment of up-to-date fittings has been placed in the Grocery Department and these should prove helpful to the Members and staff when purchases are being made. To further the sales of Greengroceries and Fruit, &c., a special section has been provided in the Central Grocery Department and it is hoped Members will support this.

The new Confectionery Department at Orchard Street was opened on Saturday, February 26th, and is progressing satisfactorily. We shall soon be modernising the Bread Bakery Department and installing a Travelling Oven, and this should assist the staff in its work and maintain the quality of our Bread.

Owing to the increase in the trade of the Dairy Department the refrigerating space has become quite inadequate and it has been necessary for an extension to be made. Plans were accordingly obtained from the Architect's Department and the work put in hand, being carried out by our own Works Department. The new refrigerating machinery required is being supplied and fixed by Messrs. Douglas and Sons of London, who installed the first machinery we had when the department was opened.

On February 11th, 1937, we obtained the use of the old Vicarage Property, 4, Colehill, Tamworth, on a lease from Mr. Stanley Dent of Tamworth. Very recently he intimated his desire to dispose of the land and buildings of which the property consists and we have contracted with him to purchase the freehold of the same.

Since the last report Miss Farley of the Drapery Department has retired on pension. Two other employees are retiring: Mr. A. H. Baldwin on September 9th and Mr. H. Ledgard on November 25th, both of the Grocery Department. Each of these employees has served the Society over a long period and there is no doubt helped in its progress, particularly in the early part of their service when long hours had to be worked for small wages, and conditions much inferior to those enjoyed by the employees to-day.

The Adult Memorial Scholarships this year were awarded to Mr. John Walker of the Delivery Department, and to Mr. Eric Perry of the Dairy Department, who are attending a week's school at the Normal College, Bangor. The Junior one was awarded to Miss Joan Smith of the Boot Department, who is attending a week's course at Collington Rise, Bexhill. We ask that a greater interest should be taken by the Members and employees in this connection.

We congratulate one of our staff (Councillor H. V. Powell) on being appointed Mayor of the Borough for this Municipal year. Councillor Powell has been a conscientious servant of the Society, and in many ways has tried to improve himself by diligent studies. He is the Manager of our Branch at Glascote. We hope he will have good health and a successful year of office.

We thank you for your continued support and the managers and staffs of the various departments for their endeavours in meeting your requirements.
