COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

FELLOW-MEMBERS,

Our report on the activities of the Society is submitted herewith and we trust it will meet with your approval.

It covers the period from July 18th, 1949, to January 16th, 1950.

The audited accounts for the same period are included.

TRADE.—The Sales for the Half Year were £365,388. For the last Half Year (27 weeks) they were £351,008, while for the corresponding period of last year they were £335,484.

MEMBERSHIP.—This is 14,122. During the Half Year 324 have joined and 63 have withdrawn or left the district.

CAPITAL.—The value of Share Capital at the end of the Half Year was £641,873, as compared with £651,649 at the commencement of the period, thus showing a decrease of £9,776.

SMALL SAVINGS claims are £11,057, as against £11,696 on July 18th, 1949.

LOAN CAPITAL is £451,623. On July 18th, 1949, it was £425,461. We trust the Members will continue to practise thrift and invest their money in Loan Capital.

On the reinvested capital a surplus of £555 was made.

PURCHASES.—The trade purchases were £291,965, made up of £225,502 from the C.W.S. Ltd., or 77.2 per cent. £54,645 from Private Trade or 18.7 per cent. £5,648 from Local Traders, or 2 per cent; and £6,170 from Productive Societies, or 2.1 per cent.

BREAD OUTPUT.—During the Half Year 229,180 stones of Bread were produced. For the last Half Year (27 weeks) the output was 240,539 stones, and for the corresponding period of last year it was 234,677 stones.

DAIRY SALES.—The sales of Milk for this Half Year were 261,147 gallons. For the last Half Year (27 weeks) they were 292,500 gallons and for the corresponding period of last year they were 248,133 gallons.

MEMBERS' PURCHASES.—These average 19s. 10 ad. per week, for this period and 18s. 9d. per week for last Half Year. For the corresponding period of last year they were 18s. 9ad. per week. The actual trading membership was 12,138 and their average purchases were £1. 3s. 1ad. as compared to £1. 1s. 7ad. for last Half Year, and £1. 1s. 7ad. per week for the corresponding period of last year.

SURPLUS DISPOSABLE.—This is £18,364. 7s. 7d. We recommend it be disposed of as follows:—

DIVIDEND.—This will be paid out in the Assembly Hall, Colehill, Tamworth, on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, March 2nd, 3rd, and 4th, between 10 a.m. and 12 noon, and 1-30 to 4 p.m., and 4-30 to 6 p.m.

GENERAL.—After long and careful consideration we decided to amalgamate the Fish and Greengrocery Departments under one manager, and Mr. Wilson of the Fish Department was placed in control. We hope you will give him your support and thus make it successful.

The work of altering the Bread Bakery Department to accommodate the Travelling Oven is proceeding, but has been held up for steel work for the roof, &c. This work has been given priority and we hope in the near future to be able to proceed with the Wood End Branch.

The death of Mr. John Davis occurred on November 21st, 1949. He was elected to the Management Committee in July, 1921, and had a long and useful experience as a member.

Mr. Thomas George Claridge passed away on December 19th, 1949. He was employed by the Society from October 1st, 1892, until April 9th, 1946, when he retired on superannuation; he gave long and sincere service to the Society in the delivery department.

The death has also occurred of one of our Arbitrators in the person of Mr. J. S. Simm, Cashier of the Co-operative Union Limited. Although not called upon to arbitrate he readily agreed if it had proved necessary.

To their families we extend our deepest sympathy in their loss.

The death of Mr. Simm created a vacancy on the panel of Arbitrators, and Mr. R. A. Southern (Acting Secretary of the Co-operative Union) was approached to fill this. He consented to act, and you will note an item on the agenda approving the appointment.

The Adult Memorial Scholarships this year will again be for an essay to be written on a subject which will be advertised later, and the Junior subject will also be notified later. We ask for entries for these, as a week spent at a Seaside School must be of benefit to the successful entrants.

With a view to stimulating interest in our Society a Joint Committee has been formed, comprising members of the Education and General Committees, to arrange for a Co-operative Gala Day which will be held on Saturday, July 1st. The Castle Grounds and Castle Pleasure Grounds, together with the Assembly Rooms have been engaged, and it is hoped to arrange for a comprehensive programme of sports, &c. in the Castle Grounds, and in the evening a dance in the Assembly Rooms. Fuller details will be advertised in due course. We have also arranged to have a Sales Campaign during the month of June. Special window displays will be made for this purpose.

Our thanks are tendered to you for the support given to the Society, and to the managers and staffs of the various departments for their endeavours in obtaining the goods to meet your requirements. For the Management Committee.
