# COMMITTEE'S REPORT

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

We have pleasure in submitting for your approval our report on the activities of the Society for the Half Year which ended on July 19th, 1954, and trust it will be satisfactory to you.

TRADE.—The Sales for the period were £560,327, as compared to £556,055 for the previous Half Year, and £547,050 for the corresponding period of last year of 27 weeks.

MEMBERSHIP.—This was 15,960 on July 19th, 1954, 515 persons having joined and 144 having left during this Half Year. We welcome these new Members and hope our various departments will prove satisfactory in supplying the goods and services they need.

SHARE CAPITAL.—At the end of the balancing period this amounted to £670,049, compared to £644,661 in January, 1954. Many Members are now allowing their money to remain in over the previous limit of £200. The law now allows £500 and the investment is a safe one with a reasonable rate of interest and easy facilities of withdrawal.

SMALL SAVINGS.—The total claims at the end of the Half Year in this section were £12,734, while at the beginning of the period they were £11,629, thus showing an increase of £1,105.

LOAN CAPITAL.—This is £492,767, compared to £487,904 for the last balancing period, an increase of £4,863.

On the re-invested capital a profit of £1,026 has been made.

PURCHASES.—The total purchases of goods for sale was £422,892, made up of £317,190 from the C.W.S. or 75·0 per cent; Private Traders, £83,230 or 19·7 per cent; Local Traders, £12,058 or 2·9 per cent; and from Productive Societies, £10,414 or 2·4 per cent.

BREAD OUTPUT.—During the Half Year 224,410 stones of bread were produced. For the last Half Year 211,821 stones were produced and for the corresponding period of last year (27 weeks) the total made was 229,804 stones.

DAIRY SALES.—These were 353,231 gallons for the Half Year under review, and 330,266 gallons for the previous period, while for the corresponding period of last year the sales were 343,489 gallons (27 weeks).

MEMBERS' PURCHASES.—These average £1. 7s. 0½d. per week. For the last Half Year they were £1. 7s. 5½d. per week. For the corresponding period of last year they equalled £1. 6s. 6½d. per week. This Half Year 14,291 Members traded and their average trade per week was £1. 10s. 2d. as compared to £1. 9s. 5½d. for last Half Year and £1. 8s. 2½d. for the corresponding period of last year.

**DIVIDEND.**—This will be paid out at the Central Premises, Colehill, Tamworth, on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, September 2nd, 3rd, and 4th between the hours of 10 a.m. to 12 noon; 1-30 to 4 p.m.; and 4-30 to 6 p.m.

Polesworth Self-Service branch was duly opened on June 17th and we hope this will be an incentive to the Members in that district to trade more at their own shop.

Dordon Branch has been modernised and the local Members have expressed satisfaction with this alteration.

The proposed alterations to the Glascote Branch have had to be deferred on account of our inability to obtain possession of the Drapery shop adjoining to conduct our trade in while the work is being carried out.

The modernisation of the General Office by the C.W.S. Shop Fittings Department is proving helpful to the Members in their cash transactions,

You will see that we have now had remitted the fine of £9. 3s, imposed on this Society in connection with a bacon prosecution at the Glascote Branch some time ago, the occurrence taking place without our knowledge or consent.

Mr. W. A. Busby has indicated that he wished to retire from the Educational Committee. He has served since 1935 and during the whole of the period has given much valuable assistance in the educational activities of our Society. Our best thanks are extended to Mr. Busby for his valued work in the welfare of the Society and its Members and employees who take advantage of the facilities offered to them.

The trading operations have not been too easy during this period. Decontrol of Butter, Margarine, Lard, Cheese, and Bacon in the Grocery Department and Branches, together with Meat, caused quite a considerable amount of worry and concern for the Managers of those departments. Prices rose and the Members showed more discrimination in their purchases, but it is hoped that a price level will be established fair and equitable to producers and consumers alike. We feel, however, that taking all things into consideration the Balance Sheet now presented is satisfactory.

The Trade Dividend from the C.W.S. has increased for this period by £3,083, and we have also received £1,551. 0s. 4s. from the Co-operative Insurance Society Ltd., as a rebate on the Collective Life Assurance Scheme for last year. This has been used to provide for a greater tax liability and also an increase of Dividend of one penny in the £ on your purchases, but we wish to point out that the greater our loyalty in purchasing productions manufactured by the Co-operative Wholesale Society the more they are able to return as Dividend, which assists in no small measure the Societies which have supported them.

Thanking you and the staffs of the departments for your support and hoping for a continuance of your confidence and trade in the future.


