DIVIDEND:—This will be paid out at the Central Premises, Colehill, Tamworth, on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, March 8th, 9th and 10th, between the hours of 10 am to 12 noon 1-30 to 4 pm and 4-30 to 6 pm.

The expenses incurred in running the Society continue to increase, and this Half-Year were £8.153 more than last times.

The largest increase is in Wages (£5,141) but, of course, as the cost of living increases our staff must of necessity have their wages increased to maintain their standard of life. The last National Wage Award operated on December 5th, 1955, and therefore the full effect of this was not felt in the Half-Year under review.

To offset this increase in Expenses, more trade is required if the rate of Dividend is to be maintained and we trust this will be forthcoming.

The Autumn Supplementary Budget had the effect of increasing purchase tax on household equipment and goods sold in the Dry Goods Departments.

Our various Departmental Managers endeavour to purchase goods to meet your needs and we hope you will trade to the best of your ability and purchase co-operatively produced goods when possible.

You will have noticed that the demolition of our old cottage property in Church Street has taken place. Consideration will be given to the erection of suitable buildings on this site to meet the trade requirements of the members. Shortage of building operatives and materials will no doubt delay the erection of the premises a little, but they will be proceeded with as circumstances permit.

You will also have seen that alterations are taking place in the front of the Baths and Institute building in Church Street.

We are endeavouring to meet the needs of our members by this extra accommodation, particularly for the sale of Baby Linen, etc., and this department will be an adjunct to our Drapery Central.

VOTING:—As there are only three nominations for three vacancies to the General Committee, no voting will be necessary on the Half-Yearly Meeting day, i.e., on Wednesday, March 7th.

Only three nominations were made at the last Half-Yearly Meeting for three seats on the Educational Committee, and therefore no voting will take place at the Half-Yearly Meeting.

You will see on the front page a photograph of the No. 4 Branch at Wilnecote. The trade here is remarkable for a small shop, averaging £904 per week. We are considering what is best to be done for the service of our members in this area, and hope to arrive at a decision soon.

So far as the Glascote Branch is concerned, we are proposing to demolish three old buildings at the rear of this property and erect a new warehouse etc. The existing shop recently occupied by Mrs. Clifford will have to be used as a warehouse while the alterations are carried out, and possibly it may remain in use in connection with the Grocery trade there.

We deeply regret the death of Mr. Harry Herbert Blood, the Radio & Television Technician, which took place on January 30th, 1956. He was employed by the Society from May 1st, 1922, until April 1929 in the Wheelwrighting Section of our Works Department. Afterwards he held several other positions in the Society's Departments until February 1938 when he went into the Furnishing Department. He served in H.M. Forces from May 14th, 1941, until July 22nd, 1946.

We extend to his wife and daughter our deepest sympathy in their bereavement and also to the other members of his family.

We also very much regret the passing of one of our Arbitrators, Major C. C. Poole, which occurred on February 2nd.

Major Poole has been an Arbitrator since April 1939, and although it has not been necessary to call on his services, we know he would willingly have given the same had he been asked to do so.

We extend to his Wife and Family also our deepest sympathy in their bereavement.

We thank you for the support you have accorded to the Society in the past and trust you will continue to give the same in the future, and also, we thank the Managers and the Staffs of our various Departments for their efforts made in the progress of the Co-operative Movement locally.

The risk is covered by the Joint Insurance Department of the C.W.S. and S.C.W.S., and Co-operators should be convinced of the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the Office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance business.

WITHDRAWALS of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by such owner of Shares. The Share Pass Book or Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or to pay money.

SHARE and SMALL SAVINGS BOOKS should be sent in regularly to be made up and audited, and the importance of this cannot be too strongly impressed upon Members. When left, the Pass Card should have the amount standing in the Share Book entered thereon and same initialled.
