DIVIDEND.—This will be paid out at the Central Premises, Colehill, Tamworth, on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, March 6th, 7th, and 8th, between the hours of 10 a.m. to 12 noon: 1-30 to 4 p.m.; and 4-30 to 6 p.m.

We are able to show an increase of Sales of £33,309 over the last Half Year end, £53,942 over the corresponding period of last year. This increase of trade has assisted us to meet the larger amount of expenses for the period of £6,244. Much of the increase was in wages as from December 2nd a general wage increase was effective. Postage increased from October 1st.

Most prices have remained fairly steady during the last few months, but the main Grocery commodities such as Bacon, Butter, Cheese, and Sugar, &c., have shown reductions, and of course, with the large quantities we sell it has affected the Departmental trade figures.

GENERAL.—Only three nominations being received for three vacancies on the General Committee no voting will be necessary at this Half-yearly Meeting, and Messrs. Collins, Day, and Egan will be re-elected on March 5th.

Since our last Report we have opened our No. 10 Branch at Mile Oak and this is progressing quite well. You will see the photograph of the premises on the front cover of the Balance Sheet. The contract for the Cattle Sale Yard has been completed, and we hope soon to see erected thereon a large Grocery Warehouse suitable to meet the increasing trade of the Society.

The erection of the Glascote Branch is proceeding satisfactorily, and we hope soon that the work will be completed on the first half of the job. As soon as this is done the demolition of the remainder of the site will be made.

Amington Branch at 264, Main Road, has taken longer than expected to complete, but we hope soon to have a shop there which will prove of lasting benefit to the Members in the locality.

The extension to the Central premises in Church Street and College Lane is waiting for plans from the Architects Department so that the work can proceed. It is proposed to erect a Furnishing and Hardware Emporium consisting of a basement and two floors as the first instalment.

On January 5th we commenced Day Baking in the Bakery Department. This became law after a long period of delay and to enable Bakers to get over their difficulties. We were able to meet ours by having a separate Confectionery Section upstairs apart from the General Bakery which is on floor level. We trust the changeover will be to the benefit of the Society and the staff, who have had for so long to work at night time.

Five of your employees are due for retirement this year, having attained the qualifying age; Mr. Walter Cotterill (Foreman Painter), Mr. George A. Stock (Secretary and Executive Officer), Miss H. Langtry (General Office), Mr. George Peers (Coach Builder), Mr. L. Leadbeater (Manager of Chemistry Department).

Mr. Cotterill commenced on October 1st, 1934, Mr. Stock on September 22nd, 1906, Miss Langtry on September 30th, 1912, Mr. Peers on March 29th, 1921, and Mr. Leadbeater on April 19th, 1922.

We hope they will have a long, happy, and healthy retirement.

Mr. H. Tomson, who has acted as one of the Scrutineers for many years has decided not to seek re-election. He has carried out his duties very conscientiously, and we appreciate his services.

We express our thanks to you for the support given during this Half Year and in previous years, and hope for a continuance of the same.
