DIVIDEND.—This will be paid out at the Central Premises, Colehill, Tamworth, on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, September 4th, 5th, and 6th, between the hours of 10 a.m. to 12 noon; 1.30 to 4 p.m.; and 4.30 to 5.30 p.m.

It will be noted that the Sales, although showing an increase over the corresponding period of last year of \$22,908, are less than the January, 1958, Half Year, which included the Christmas period, by £10,401. A glance at the table on page 4 will show you that decreases have been recorded on the Drapery, Outfitting, Furnishing, and Chemists Departments and the Sweets and Tobacco.

The Grocery Department, despite fierce competition and stunt selling by our competitors and some reduced prices, i.e., Butter, Canned Goods, &c., has actually shown an increase of £9,141 over last Half Year.

No doubt the reduced earnings of our Miner Members, together with most unfavourable summer weather, have something to do with the lower volume of business in the Clothing and Furniture

Our expenses have increased, the chief item being wages £5,200, which has to be met out of lower turnover.

We have been able to recommend a Dividend of 1s. 4d., the same as last Half Year, but whether this can be maintained is doubtful unless Sales are increased to meet the constantly rising expenses. In effect, the Dividend depends on our ability to satisfy your requirements, and on you as Members for support in all departments.

DEVELOPMENTS.—During the Half Year Glascote old buildings have been demolished, and part of the new Branch is in use. Progress is being made with the remainder, and we hope to be in occupation of the whole building soon after this Report is in your hands.

Amington Branch has been transferred to the new address, 264, Main Road, and is doing well. Tenders have been sent out for the Central Premises extension, and there is now a prospect of work starting shortly on the new Furnishing and Hardware Departments.

Plans and working drawings are being studied for a Grocery Warehouse on the old Cattle Sale Yard site, and we look forward to a development here which will relieve the pressure on the Aldergate premises, and possibly allow for further development there.

Further accommodation is now available at the Garage, the new extension is now in use, and we have more room for our Electric Vehicles.

We have also carried out a major repair to the roof of the Funeral Service Department Garage, and now have an excellent building for the fine fleet of cars possessed by that department.

Pressure on the Dairy is increasing. You will note the record Sales, and the premises are now inadequate for the trade.

GENERAL.—We are trying to meet competition in the Bread and Confectionery trade by giving you a better service, and some Rounds have been altered with this in view. Only time will tell

whether we have been successful.

A new Butchery Manager has been engaged. Mr. L. F. Tilford, who comes from Eastleigh, in Hampshire, is now at work with the object of giving you the best service possible. We welcome him

to our ranks and wish him every success.

As many Members will be aware, the retirement took place on June 21st last, of Mr. George

Albert Stock, Secretary and Executive Officer during the last 16 years.

Mr. Stock had served the Society for over 51 years—a record unlikely to be equalled by any

We are sure that our Members will wish him and his wife a long and happy retirement.

We regret to record the death of Mr. Harry Payne, of the Grocery Warehouse. Although Mr. Payne had only been with us for 7½ years, he had established a reputation as a straightforward and conscientious employee.

We extend our sympathy to his relatives.

We regret also to record the sudden death of Mr. John W. Stafford, member of the Board of Management for over 20 years. A genial and likeable personality well known in Co-operative circles, he will be remembered for his advocacy of a Branch to serve our Polesworth Members, which has materialised in the fine building we have there and is our first and, so far, only venture into Self-Service.

We extend our sympathy to his family in their bereavement.

Finally, we thank you for your support and also the staff for their services, and we are hopeful of continued success in the future.

WITHDRAWALS of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by such owner of Shares. The Share Pass Book or Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or to pay money.

SHARE and SMALL SAVINGS BOOKS should be sent in regularly to be made up and audited, and the importance of this cannot be too strongly impressed upon Members. When left, the Pass Card should have the amount standing in the Share Book entered thereon and same initialled.

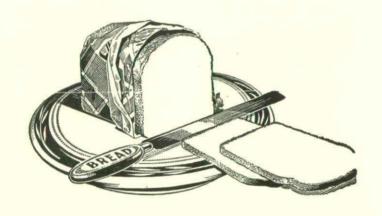
