COMMITTEE'S REPORT—continued

Our net membership, just 12 short of the 18,000, continues to increase steadily, and the number of trading Members by a like amount.

The actual trade per week per trading Member, £1 18s. 8d., although rising slowly, indicates a low percentage of our Members' possible trade; it is obvious that there is room for improvement here.

The Sales, £815,839, represent an increase of £15,921 or 2 per cent over last Half Year—a considerable slowing down in the rate of progress. We are not alone in this, of course, if that is any consolation. What is happening, though, is that expenses are not slowing down in proportion.

Departments showing increases over last Half Year are the Drapery, Outfitting, Furnishing, Sweets and Tobacco, Footwear, Chemists, Milk Bar, and Butchery.

Share Capital continues to increase, many Members allowing their holdings to go over £200 now that the limit is £500.

We are rather disappointed with Small Savings. Holders of these books are the Co-operators of the future, and we should like to see more interest in these youngsters' accounts.

DEVELOPMENTS—CENTRAL PREMISES EXTENSION.—As most Members are aware, work is in progress on the College Lane—Church Street site, and the large excavation will house the Sales Basement, heating apparatus, lift well, &c. Foundations are being prepared for the steel stanchions which will support the new building and progress will be more obvious when this report is in your hands.

GLASCOTE.—After some delays and frustrations we have been able to get the fixtures changed to give self-service and to include frozen foods and meat. We hope Members will like the new facilities as they become accustomed to this modern method of trading.

DORDON.—We are exploring the possibilities of extending this branch—the Butchery side is far too cramped for the amount of business done.

GROCERY WAREHOUSE.—We regret to report lack of progress here, although the matter is being actively pursued. We hope to get over the planning difficulties before this report reaches you, and then push on with this urgently needed building.

BREAD DELIVERY (5 DAY).—Three more rounds went on this improved service in January, and at the time of writing, we are anxiously awaiting the arrival of three smart electric vehicles to modernise our service. We shall appreciate comments from Members on these vehicles and on the service provided. We are particularly anxious to meet the acute competition which is developing in this trade between the Co-opera-

tive Movement on the one hand and a few nationally well-organised private interests on the other hand, and we want to do it with our own men, plant, and equipment.

COAL.—This Department has been a continual source of difficulty for years, and its continuance has been a subject for discussion by your Committee on many occasions.

It is hoped that by the time this Report reaches you, conditions will have improved—we do not want to see your Coal business go if it can be avoided.

The Surplus Disposable is £60,115 2s. 3d. We recommend it to be allocated as follows:

Expenses have increased in this Half Year. The most important item being wages, which are up £2,437.

We regret to record the death of Mr. Arthur Bridgewater, retired Member of our Grocery Staff and one-time Mayor of the Borough. He served the Society faithfully and well for 22 years to the date of his retirement in April, 1940, and we extend our sympathy to his relatives. He was one of our earliest pensioners.

We have also lost a well-known Co-operator and one-time Member of our Management Committee and also one-time Mayor of the Borough, in the person of Mr. George H. Jones. We extend our sympathy to his family in their bereavement.

In conclusion, we thank all Members for their support, and the staff who have helped to make this Report possible.

CHRISTMAS CLUB.—Deposits received at any time in any Department or the Office from 1st January to 1st December. Allowances in goods as follows: For 5s. deposited, goods allowed to 5s. 3d.; for 10s. deposited, goods allowed to 10s. 6d.; for 15s. deposited, goods allowed to 15s. 9d.; for 20s. deposited, goods allowed to 21s. Further particulars given on application.

MEMBERS' ATTENTION is directed to Rule XX, whereby they may nominate the party to whom the money standing to their credit may be paid at their decease. If Members would attend to this rule the money could be transferred at their death free of expense, and those entitled to receive the money, saved a considerable amount of trouble.

The risk is covered by the Joint Insurance Department of the C.W.S. and S.C.W.S., and Co-operators should be convinced of the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the Office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance business.

WITHDRAWALS of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by such owner of Shares. The Share Pass Book or Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or to pay money.
