COMMITTEE'S REPORT

FELLOW-MEMBERS,

The following Report upon the activities of your Society for the Half-Year ended 11th January, 1960, is presented for your approval.

MEMBERSHIP, 420 have joined the Society and 152 have withdrawn, making a net increase of 270. We now have 18,391 Members.

SHARE CAPITAL.—£810,354 shows an increase of £6,649 over last Half Year.

LOAN CAPITAL.—£374,741 is down on last Half Year by £20,862. This is quite a usual feature—many thousands of pounds are withdrawn for Christmas Clubs.

SMALL SAVINGS.—£14,999, down by £840, is similarly affected at this time of the year—but it compares favourably with a year ago. We are thinking of ways and means to attract the interest of young people in their own bank.

The overall capital position is quite satisfactory and reflects the thrifty nature of Tamworth people.

TRADE.—Sales for the Half Year are £804,983, an increase of £8,837, or 1.1 per cent, but compared with 12 months ago there is a decline of £10,856, although a large portion of this is due to the ending of a wholesale contract for bread supplied to Atherstone Society

Trade conditions have not been easy. The fine summer had its disadvantages. In many departments Sales were affected—Bread, Coal, Clothing for example.

Cut price and stunt trading has been encountered, and more is expected, and your Committee will be considering how it can be met, if possible without the abandoning of the Society's traditional fair trading policy.

Members purchases from the Society averaged £1 17s. 1d. per week per trading Member, or £1 13s. 8d. calculated on total membership.

DEVELOPMENTS—Central Premises.—We have been disappointed over the new building, many difficulties having been met in this contract. At the time you receive this report we hope to have some idea of the completion and the probable opening date.

Victoria Road, Grocery Warehouse.—Tenders for this work will be out shortly.

Dordon Branch: Extension.—The necessary planning permission has been obtained and working drawings and quantities are being prepared.

Delivery by horse vehicle.—We have progressed a stage further. More rounds are being transferred to electric vehicles. Our operations are hindered by the lack of suitably qualified salesmen.

Butchery.—We are contemplating improvements in our productive department in order to bring it more in line with modern requirements for the meat trade and it is possible that we may have to consider moving the abattoir from its present site.

If Members would attend to this rule the money could be transferred at their death free of expense, and those entitled to receive the money, saved a considerable amount of trouble.

A new law has raised to £200 the total amount which may be nominated, but this applies to nominations made on or after 5th August, 1954.

Nominations made before that date are still valid, but up to £100 only. Members wishing to take advantage of the increased amount now allowed, must make a new nomination.

Full information may be obtained from the office.

SMALL SAVINGS BANK.—Deposits are received at any time during office hours. Sums from 1d. to 40s. may be deposited, but not more than £50 can be on deposit at one time. Interest at the rate of £3 per cent per annum is paid on each sum of 4s. remaining on deposit for three months.

LOANS.—Deposits received at any time during office hours. Interest at the rate of £2 10s. per cent per annum.

MEMBERS CHANGING THEIR ADDRESS should intimate the same to the Secretary.

TWENTY WEEKS CLUB.—We have in operation a Twenty Weeks Club, for goods from the Furnishing, Drapery, Millinery, Outfitting, Boots, Coal, or Chemistry Departments. Vouchers of £1 minimum and £12 maximum are issued from the Office, to be repaid at the rate of 1s. per £-per week.

CO-OPERATIVE INSURANCE.—We are in a position to effect Insurances of all kinds—Life, Fire, Burglary, Motor, Live Stock, and Accident. The risk is covered by the Joint Insurance Department of the C.W.S. and S.C.W.S., and Co-operators should be convinced of the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the Office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance business.

WITHDRAWALS of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by such owner of Shares. The Share Pass Book or Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or to pay money.

SHARE and SMALL SAVINGS BOOKS should be sent in regularly to be made up and audited, and the importance of this cannot be too strongly impressed upon Members. When left, the Pass Card should have the amount standing in the Share Book entered thereon and same initialled.

HALF-YEARLY DIVIDEND WILL BE PAID AT THE CENTRAL ON THURSDAY, FRIDAY, AND SATURDAY, 3rd, 4th, and 5th MARCH, between the hours of 10 a.m. to noon, 1-30 to 4 p.m., and 4-30 to 5-30 p.m. Members are requested to bring their Pass Cards for production at the time of payment.
