### **Committee's Report**

Fellow-Members,

We have pleasure in presenting the Report of the Committee of Management for your approval.

MEMBERSHIP.—18,661. 408 have joined the Society, 138 have left, making a net increase of 270.

CAPITAL.—Members' Share Capital stands at £827,111, an increase of £16,757.

Loan Capital at £387,504 also shows an increase of £12,763.

Small Savings, £16,175, show a gratifying increase of £1,176.

TRADE.—Sales, £829,928 for the Half Year. This is for a 27-week period. The increase of £33,782 over last year is due mainly to the extra week, but the average trade per week is £30,738, and is up by £117 per week.

Nearly all departments, helped by the extra week, showed an increase, but it has been by no means an easy Half Year.

The average trade per trading Member per week was £1 16s. 11d. or £1 12s. 11d., calculated on total membership.

STAFF.—The labour position has worsened considerably, particularly on house-to-house delivery. We have not yet found the answer to the five-day week and higher wages offered by prosperous local industry to junior and senior males. Some of the figures quoted to us are fantastic. Somehow or other an answer must be found if this essential service is to be maintained, let alone extended.

**DEVELOPMENTS—CENTRAL.**—You will have seen the new Drapery and Furnishing stores in College Lane and Church Street, opened on 18th June last. We are quite pleased with the new shop, and trading results so far are very satisfactory. If you can keep this up it shall not be long before we can commence stage two of our reconstruction programme.

In the meantime we are temporarily transferring the Footwear Department to the old Furnishing Department to give the Chemists more room, and there will be other developments on Colehill to follow.

Grocery Warehouse.—Matters are moving, and we hope to have the builders in by the time this report is in your hands.

Dordon Reconstruction.—This is proving to be an expensive business, and is receiving your Committee's close study.

Bolehall.—We have commenced reconstruction by our own Works Department. Some inconvenience will be occasioned but Members in that area will forgive us when they see the results of our labours. We hope to make them a nice little shop, and effect a vast improvement from the hygienic point of view.

During the reconstruction a travelling shop will be used in order to allow as much space as possible for the builders.

**MEMBERS'** ATTENTION is directed to Rule XX, whereby they may nominate the party to whom the money standing to their credit may be paid at their decease. If Members would attend to this rule the money could be transferred at their death free of expense, and those entitled to receive the money saved a considerable amount of trouble.

A new law has raised to £200 the total amount which may be nominated, but this applies to nominations made on or after 5th August, 1954.

Nominations made before that date are still valid, but up to £100 only. Members wishing to take advantage of the increased amount now allowed, must make a new nomination.
