Committee's Report

FELLOW-MEMBERS.

We have pleasure in presenting the Report of the Committee of Management for your approval.

MEMBERSHIP.—Four hundred and thirty-one applications have been received. Two hundred and eighty accounts have been withdrawn or closed, leaving a net membership of 18,881 an increase of 151 over January, 1961.

CAPITAL.—Members' Share Capital now stands at £851,214—an increase of £19,343.

Loan Capital at £386,854 shows an increase of £9,918.

Small Savings, £17,138, are up by £2,257. This is a most pleasing feature, and a record, apparently.

It is most important that youngsters become savings minded, and if cooperatively savings minded, so much the better.

TRADE.—The Sales for the Half Year are £838,495, which is a record for any July period. Compared with the 27-week period of July, 1960, an increase is shown of £8,567 or 4.9 per cent on a weekly basis. Nevertheless, this rate of increase is not sufficient to meet rising expenses, and your attention is drawn to the average weekly trade per Member, which at £1 14s. 2d. per week leaves much room for improvement.

STAFF.—Despite shorter hours and increased wage rates, we are still experiencing labour difficulties in some departments, particularly Dairy and Bakery Delivery. Efforts are being made to make conditions as attractive as possible, although it would appear that only long term measures such as the recruitment and training of juniors will solve our problems.

DEVELOPMENTS.—The Grocery Warehouse is nearing completion and will be in use before the end of the year.

This new building will also provide a new Dairy Depot, and some amendments have been made to the structure to accommodate this Department. When complete we shall have ample facilities for both Dairy and Grocery for some years, with room for further expansion.

The transfer of the warehouse to its new site will give us more room at the Central Grocery and further improvements are contemplated in shopping facilities.

Dordon reconstruction is still proceeding but some progress is now being made. We ask our Dordon Members to bear with us for a short period.

A new experiment is to be tried with an "Instant Dividend" Economy Store on Colehill and part of the Milk Bar premises is being adapted for this purpose.

The rate of dividend is maintained at 1s. in the £ for the third successive Half Year, but it is obvious from the trading results that only by a tremendous upsurge in sales and improved efficiency can this be continued.

One of our fundamental principles is to distribute the surplus as fairly as possible, and only those Members who are equally loyal in all departments can expect the full dividend on all purchases. This subject is receiving very serious consideration by your Committee, particularly in relation to those departments which cannot be expected to return a dividend of 1s., and in consequence have to be subsidised by the others.

DIVIDEND.—Payment will be made in the Basement of the new premises on the corner of College Lane, on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, the 14th, 15th, and 16th September, 1961.

Times of payment: 9 a.m. to 12 noon, 1-30 to 4 p.m., and 4-30 to 5-30 p.m. Members must produce their Pass Cards, except in such cases where the card is in the office.

It is not compulsory to withdraw dividend at these times.

RETIREMENT.—Mr. T. Sellers, the Society's Cashier, after more than 40 years' loyal and devoted service.

On your behalf we wish him a long and happy retirement.

MEMBERS' ATTENTION is directed to Rule XX, whereby they may nominate the party to whom the money standing to their credit may be paid at their decease. If Members would attend to this rule the money could be transferred at their death free of expense, and those entitled to receive the money saved a considerable amount of trouble.

A new law has raised to £200 the total amount which may be nominated, but this applies to nominations made on or after 5th August, 1954.

Nominations made before that date are still valid, but up to £100 only. Members wishing to take advantage of the increased amount now allowed, must make a new nomination.

Full information may be obtained from the Office.

SHARES.—Maximum holding may now be increased to £1,000.

SMALL SAVINGS BANK.—Deposits are received at any time during office hours. Sums from 1d. to 40s, may be deposited, but not more than £50 can be on deposit at one time. Interest at the rate of £3 per cent per annum.

WITHDRAWALS of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by such owner of Shares. The Share Pass Book or Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or to pay money.

SHARE and SMALL SAVINGS BOOKS should be sent in regularly to be made up and audited, and the importance of this cannot be too strongly impressed upon Members. When left, the Pass Card should have the amount standing in the Share Book entered thereon and same initialled.
