### **Committee's Report**

FELLOW MEMBERS,

We have pleasure in presenting the Report of the Committee of Management for your approval.

MEMBERSHIP.—Our membership continues to increase steadily at the rate of approximately 20 per week, and now stands at 20,828. However, we are not just interested in additional names in the register but seek to do everything possible to encourage them all to be full trading Members, keenly alive to the ideals of the Co-operative Movement and taking an active interest in all its affairs.

CAPITAL.—Again we are pleased to show an increase in the total savings of Members and depositors of £16,137. This is only a relatively small increase, and mainly due to the fact that many of our new Members are not aware of the excellent deposit and easy withdrawal facilities provided by our public counter at the General Office. We appeal to parents to encourage their children to open Small Savings Accounts now, and to join as Members when 16 years of age in a healthy Society of considerable financial strength.

TRADE.—We have at last achieved an annual turnover of two million pounds (£2,051,059) and it has been done in great style. The Half Year's Sales of £1,064,711 are of course an all time record, giving us an increase of £92,172 or 9.5 per cent over the corresponding period. The increase for the year at £200,229 is itself also a record. Average weekly trade per Member is up slightly, in spite of the rise in membership, but again indicates that we can still set our sights higher for greater achievements. Obviously within such a splendid overall figure there has been record performances from a number of departments. The Grocery department reaches £400,000 for the first time with Sales records being broken by the following branches: The Supermarket and Central Grocery, Amington, Bolehall, Gillway, and the Mobile Shop. The Butchery and Dairy also show substantial increases in cash and volume sales. All the Dry Goods departments return the highest ever sales, with special congratulations to the Pharmacy with an increase of over 18 per cent. Our new ventures, Dosthill Grocery, Wines and Spirits, and the Stationery are making very encouraging progress, but are all capable of absorbing more trade. There are a few decreases but it is not an indication of failure or lack of effort. It merely points to the need for closer examination of their problems and a determination to solve them. We congratulate the Officials, Departmental Managers, and Staff for a splendid effort, and thank you, the Members, for your support and confidence.

STAFF.—The Half Year has not been without staff problems, and the whole of the retail trade finds it very difficult to compete with industry for the right type of labour. This Society is trying to provide one of the most comprehensive delivery services in the Midlands, but it should be appreciated that it has to be paid for out of very small margins. We are sure that you wish to see our employees get the best possible wages and conditions, but improvements can only be made with your co-operation. Our educational and training facilities programme is beginning to bear fruit, and this year we have had more examination successes among employees than ever before. Young people with ability, enthusiasm, and confidence should inquire about careers in the Co-operative Movement, starting with Tamworth Society. We can offer them great opportunity, with a secure and promising future.

**RETIREMENTS.**—Mr. G. Pettifer, of the Confectionery Department, has retired during the Half Year, after 41 years' service, and we extend to him our best wishes for good health, together with a long and happy well-earned retirement.

#### **OBITUARY**

We regret to record the death of Mr. W. H. Thompson, aged 47, an employee in the Confectionery Department, and extend our deepest sympathy to his wife and family.

**DIVIDEND.**—Despite the ever growing expenses we are again very gratified to be able to pay a Dividend of 1s. in the £. The total amount of surplus for disposal is £64,659, and we recommend the following allocations:
