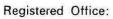

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Committee's Report

FELLOW MEMBERS,

We present for your consideration and approval our report for the year ending 17th January, 1972.

Membership

The number of applicants to join the Society has been the highest for many years and we are very pleased to find that most of the newcomers to Tamworth lose no time in taking advantage of the services we offer. There is however, still a lack of stability in the area due to a variety of reasons, with unemployment, short-time, and the shortage of jobs in the town, well up on the list. This, no doubt, explains a higher rate of turnover in membership and we now find it necessary to review the register more often to eliminate the names of members who have lapsed. Our latest count reveals a total of 24,501 members and at this figure we are able to claim a very high percentage of active membership.

Capital and Reserves

Strong reserves are one of the hallmarks of any good business and we therefore take great pride in reporting a substantial increase in the General Reserve Fund. Members capital in Shares, Loans and Small Savings is also up on last year bringing the combined total of Capital and Reserves up to £1,590,981.

The degree of confidence which is indicated by the higher volume in all forms of banking business transacted at the General Office reflects great credit to the Society and all those involved in providing the service.

Investments

We consider that our investment folio is well balanced and secure. The ratio of investments to members capital is amongst the best in the Co-operative Movement and with a total of £1,065,126 we have adequate funds for trade development in this rapidly growing town.

Trade

Modern business to-day needs very large capital resources and a typical example of this can be found in the growth of colour television because the great majority of sets are hired on rental. So far, we have been very successful in this field and our only regret at the moment is that demand still outstrips supply. Our engineers continue to enhance their reputation for an excellent service and the receivers we have adopted are highly acclaimed for the quality of picture and reliability.

Trade generally was very quiet for most of the year, but in the last three months a considerable improvement was achieved which more than doubled the overall increase. The total sales for the year are £3,196,753 an increase of £164,535 or 5.4%. Some very creditable performances have again been registered by a number of branches and departments to mark new all-time records. The Church Street Supermarket, in fact, broke its previous best figures no less than five times in succession during the weeks prior to Christmas. For the first time in many years we are beginning to show a volume increase in bread sales, and though only very modest it is an encouragement to the efforts of the delivery staff and an acknowledgement of what we believe is the best bread sold in this district.

Staff

We are quite certain that the hard core of our permanent full-time employees place a high value on security in their job. It is for this reason that we are particularly pleased in being able to announce further improvements to the Superannuation Fund which have had the unanimous backing and approval from the Board. When ratified our scheme will be amongst the best in the movement and we believe rightly so.

Evans, Coal (11 years); Mr. V. Tomson (49 years) and Mr. A. Wagstaff (11 years) Bakery; Mr. S. Shakespeare, Works (11 years); Mr. G. L. Jinks, Caretaker (16 years). We express our grateful thanks for their services and wish them a long and happy retirement.

Dividend

Though not yet quite extinct in the Co-operative Movement the system of paying a cash dividend is becoming increasingly rare. Even more rare is a dividend of 4% which is another way of expressing four new pence to the pound, and we are therefore reasonably confident the recommendation we now make in that respect will receive your acceptance and approval.

The past year has by no means been an easy one, but the innumerable problems were tackled with commendable success, members, staff and management working together in our common aim. We thank everyone who has shared in this effort and trust that 1972 will bring continued progress for Co-operation in Tamworth.

CHRISTMAS SAVING STAMP CLUB—Stamps may be purchased at any time in Departments or the Office. The amount saved can be spent in any Department of the Society. Interest is added at the rate of 5 per cent in addition to full dividend. Further particulars given on application.

CO-OPERATIVE TRAVEL SERVICE.—Excellent holidays can be arranged through this Service, including your foreign currency requirements. Inquire at the Registered Office.

MEMBERS' ATTENTION is directed to Rule XX, whereby they may nominate the party to whom the money standing to their credit may be paid at their decease. If Members would attend to this rule the money could be transferred at their death free of expense and those entitled to receive the money saved a considerable amount of trouble.

A new law has raised to £500 the total amount which may be nominated, but this applies to nominations made on or after 4th September, 1965.

Nominations made before that date are still valid, but up to £100 or £200 only. Members wishing to take advantage of the increased amount now allowed, must make a new nomination.

Full information may be obtained from the Office.

SHARES.—Maximum holding may now be increased to £1,000.

SMALL SAVINGS BANK.—Deposits are received at any time during office hours. Sums from 1p to £2 may be deposited, but not more than £50 can be on deposit at one time.

LOANS.—Deposits received at any time during office hours.

MEMBERS CHANGING THEIR ADDRESS should inform the Registered Office immediately.

CO-OPERATIVE INSURANCE.—We are in a position to effect Insurances of all kinds—Life, Fire, Burglary, Motor, Live Stock, and Accident. The risk is covered by the Joint Insurance Department of the C.W.S. and S.C.W.S., and Co-operators should realise the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the Office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance business.

WITHDRAWALS of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by the owner of the Shares. The Share Pass Book or Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or to pay money.

SHARE, LOAN, and SMALL SAVINGS BOOKS should be sent in regularly to be made up and audited, and the importance of this cannot be too strongly impressed upon Members. When left, the Pass Card should have the amount standing in the Share Book entered thereon and initialled.
