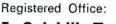

Committee's Report

FELLOW MEMBERS.

We present for your consideration and approval our report for the year ending 20th January, 1975.

Membership

The membership of the Society is now 27,053, an increase of 880 on last year.

Capital and Reserves

In the light of current economic and financial circumstances we have held our capital position with commendable success and can still claim one of the highest average holdings per member in the country. An increasing proportion of total capital is now collectively owned in the form of reserves with the General Reserve Fund alone standing at well over a quarter of a million pounds. Tremendous sums of money are now required to finance a business the size of ours and we are indeed fortunate not only to be independent of outside assistance but to have a reasonable surplus over our day to day needs. This can only be built up over many years by adhering to prudent financial policies which in turn generate increasing confidence from the members.

Investments

During the year we have seen some of our liquid assets being converted to bricks and mortar as work progressed on the completion of the second floor of the Central Premises. In addition more of our money is now utilised in stock, the financing of Credit, and other capital absorbing items, but even with all these extra demands the total of re-invested capital stands at £1,027,677.

Trade

The repetition of references to inflation get quite monotonous but if we did not qualify our sales figures by the extent of its influence we could certainly be criticised and quite rightly so. Having said that however we would need a special computer to tell us by exactly how much inflation has effected our figures since it is complicated enough to measure its effect on a single specialised business and we are a complex mixture of many. Suffice to say that without an overall increase of at least 15% volume decreases would almost certainly be indicated. Our increase in cash trade after adjusting last years figures, to 52 weeks is £695,178 or 18.1% more than twice the amount ever shown in a year before bringing the Annual Sales to £4,527,175. We believe this is a very creditable performance showing real progress, especially if one takes into account all the many difficulties which have been experienced in the last twelve months. Some departments have done exceptionally well, including the following units with increases of over 25%:- Supermarket, Glascote, Wood End, Kingsbury, Men's Wear and Furnishing.

Developments

Work on the Central Premises extensions has been in progress for most of the year and we hope to complete the main structural work by the end of March. Some inconvenience both to customers and staff was inevitable and we are grateful for the co-operation given by the Store Manager, Mr. Jermy and all his staff through a most trying period. We now have a store worth something like one and a quarter million pounds and it stands in the books at only a fraction of its market value thus representing additional reserves of great strength. The whole appearance of the building has been greatly enhanced, particularly the view coming up Church Street from Aldergate. It is not only a credit to the Co-operative Movement, but a credit to the town of Tamworth belonging as it does to ordinary people from all walks of life and interest who make up our membership. Our policy is one of continual improvement, in the belief that only the best is good enough for the members of this Society.

Not without considerable difficulty we have at last managed to open a Travel Bureau having gained the much coveted membership of the A.B.T.A. thus adding yet another service to the many already provided for our members.

During the year we purchased a suite of House and Shop Property in Upper Gungate, the latter being re-furbished as a Pharmacy with a view to giving members living North of the town a much more convenient dispensing and pharmaceutical service.

The Grocery Warehouse has been leased to Pirelli Limited thus completing the total package envisaged when we entered into an agreement with the Birmingham Society for the procurement and supply of Groceries and provisions. A very large sum of money has been released which was previously tied up in stocks and we shall now have an income from the building as opposed to occupancy expenses.

Staff

The high rate of turnover continues to be an expensive and frustrating problem, but whilst retail distribution is expected to provide six and seven day week services with earnings often much less than in industry we fear there will be little relief. Competition is at the moment fiercer than ever but there are signs of contraction and we envisage many changes in the retail field which will effect the labour position over the next few years.

There have been two more retirements since our last report:—

Mr. E. Leedham 13 years — Bakery Department.

Mr. G. W. Orchard 27 years — Delivery.

Dividend

So long as we feel that the majority of members still prefer a cash dividend and that it is administratively and economically possible to continue our traditional method of returning the profit to those who help to create it, then dividend days will continue to be a feature of this Society. NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

Net Sales

Includes Cash Sales, Goods sold on credit and Rentals paid.

2. Trading Stocks

Stocks are valued at Cost or Retail less an appropriate discount to reduce to cost.

3 Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on Fixed Assets and Television Sets on rental. This charge is calculated to write off the assets over their expected useful life annually by the straight line method as follows:—

Freehold Land and Buildings Fixtures, Fittings and Machinery Transport

Not less than 2½% per annum Not less than 10% per annum Not less than 20% per annum

Television Sets are depreciated over the estimated life of the assets by the straight line method.

4. Tax Equalisatio

Provision is made for the tax deferred by reason of capital allowances for tax purposes exceeding the corresponding depreciation charges in the accounts.

5. Investment Income

Interest on investments is that which has been received or credited to the account.

6. Debtors

Club Accounts, Hire Purchase and Credit Sales Accounts and other Accounts are included at gross values less suitable provisions for Bad and Doubtful Debts and any liability under the Supply of Goods (Implied Terms) Act, 1973.

7. Superannuation Fund

The Employees Superannuation Fund is not invested in the Society.

8. Capital Expenditure

- (b) Capital Expenditure authorised by the Committee but not yet contracted, Nil.

MEMBER RELATIONS

Every month during the year the Member Relations Committee has met to consider and deliberate on the working of the Co-operative Movement, and on ways to increase the interest of you, the Co-operative Member, in the principles and practice of your own Movement. This is not an easy project, twelve months ago in the 1973 Report, you were asked for your ideas and suggestions for increasing Member participation in the affairs of your own Society, although nothing was received during 1974, your Committee is hopeful that the Secretary will be hearing from you soon.

Our Pathfinder Groups have had some disturbance, but have now settled down with two new Leaders, whose names are given at the end of this Report. The Junior Group is at full strength, but there is room for a few more girls of 11 to 15 years in the Senior Group. Girls wishing to join should contact the Leader or any group member.

Co-operative Ballet under the devoted tuition of Miss McCracken continues to thrive, and by now hundreds of girls, while not all becoming ballerinas, have been taught to dance and appreciate Ballet, and some have become highly skilled in the art.

The Woodcraft Folk at Kingsbury had a good year with increased membership and activities, but then at the end of the year had to face the tragic loss of one of their Leaders, Mrs. Margaret Johnson. It is not possible to write in a few lines of the loss that the Movement has suffered by the accidental death of Margaret Johnson. She was one of the new young Co-operators, devoting practically the whole of her leisure time to the Woodcraft Folk Fellowship, which she and her husband started in Kingsbury. She regularly attended Society meetings, and was also a valued member of the Member Relations Committee. Perhaps the best memorial that can be offered is that whoever takes her place on the Committee should strive to be as good and sincere a Co-operator as she was.

CHRISTMAS SAVING STAMP CLUB—Stamps may be purchased at any time in Departments or the Office. The amount saved can be spent in any Department of the Society. Interest is added at the rate of 5 per cent in addition to full dividend. Further particulars given on application.

CO-OPERATIVE TRAVEL SERVICE.—We are now members of the A.B.T.A. and can arrange holidays in any part of the world, including your foreign currency requirements. The Travel Bureau is in the new Central Premises, College Lane, Tamworth.

MEMBERS' ATTENTION is directed to Rule XX, whereby they may nominate the party to whom the money standing to their credit may be paid at their decease. If Members would attend to this rule the money could be transferred at their death free of expense and those entitled to receive the money saved a considerable amount of trouble.

A new law has raised to £500 the total amount which may be nominated, but this applies to nominations made on or after 4th September, 1965.

Nominations made before that date are still valid, but up to £100 or £200 only. Members wishing to take advantage of the increased amount now allowed, must make a new nomination.

Full information may be obtained from the Office.

SHARES .- Maximum holding may now be increased to £1,000.

SMALL SAVINGS BANK.—Deposits are received at any time during office hours. Sums from 1p to £2 may be deposited, but not more than £50 can be on deposit at one time.

LOANS.-Deposits received at any time during office hours.

MEMBERS CHANGING THEIR ADDRESS should inform the Registered Office immediately.

CO-OPERATIVE INSURANCE.—We are in a position to effect Insurances of all kinds—Life, Holiday, Fire, Burglary, Motor, Live Stock, and Accident. Co-operators should realise the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the Office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance business.

WITHDRAWALS of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by the owner of the Shares. The Share Pass Book or Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or to pay money.

SHARE, LOAN, and SMALL SAVINGS BOOKS should be sent in regularly to be made up and audited, and the importance of this cannot be too strongly impressed upon Members. When left, the Pass Card should have the amount standing in the Share Book entered thereon and initialled.
