

Committee's Report

FELLOW MEMBERS,

We present for your consideration and approval this interim report for the current financial year.

Membership

The number of members continues to increase steadily and now stands at 27,545.

Capital and Reserves

After a lapse of nearly six years we are very pleased to report that our Share Capital is once again back over the one million pounds mark, to reach £1,024,821, a distinction shared by only thirty Societies in the country. Reserves now exceed £300,000, showing a very sound and healthy financial position though no business these days can afford to under estimate the problems which lie ahead and those without strong foundations face severe difficulties.

Investments

The proportion of re-investments to members' capital is approximately 80% and although this percentage has fallen in the last twelve months due to the development programme, it can still be regarded as very satisfactory, and we are not handicapped by the liquidity problems which confront so many firms at the present time.

Trade

Annual turnover is now in excess of five million pounds with an increase in this first six months of £473,018 or 23.10%. Top of the sales league in percentage terms is Dosthill Grocery Branch with a 53% increase, closely followed by Mile Oak, 45%, Bolehall 44%, and Glascote 42%.

There is a marked fall in the volume sales of cigarettes and whilst this should certainly be welcomed on health grounds, the effect on sales and cost ratios is quite significant. Dry goods trade in the Central Premises has been adversely effected through all the disturbance caused by the extensions and although the main contractors have finished much work remains to be done in respect of the internal design and lay-out which we are doing ourselves. All departments and sections should be settled in their new locations well in time for the Christmas Trade and subject to the general economic climate, the prospects for substantial increases in sales look very good indeed.

Expenses

Even the Apollo Moon Rocket would be hard pressed to match the acceleration rate of expenses at the present time and the situation is very disturbing not just for Tamworth Co-operative Society, but for the whole nation. Personnel expenses alone have increased by £134,610, a rise of 39.2%. Personnel expenses now account for 73% of all the trading expenses combined and since control of nearly all the other major items is outside our hands, special attention must of necessity be focused in this area.

Staff

Great efforts are being made with the help of the Staff Training Officer to raise efficiency at all levels through systematic training. Full use is being made of the Training Boards and maximum grants have been obtained.

Interim Dividend

The amount of dividend we are able to recommend reflects the serious problems of the times and our determination to pursue policies which are sound. Our interim accounts indicate that £103,450 is available for distribution making it possible to declare a basic rate of 3.75%.

The cost of delivery is now enormous and serious thought is being given to this problem particularly in respect of the dividend policy. The imposition of further or increased charges for delivery does not appear to be the solution and it may be necessary to declare differential rates of dividend to preserve some equity in its distribution amongst the members.

We trust our recommendation will receive your full approval, and once again may we thank all members and employees for their support and confidence.

Notices of Interest to Every Member

CHRISTMAS SAVING STAMP CLUB—Stamps may be purchased at any time in Departments or the Office. The amount saved can be spent in any Department of the Society. Interest is added at the rate of 5 per cent in addition to full dividend. Further particulars given on application.

CO-OPERATIVE TRAVEL SERVICE.—We are now members of the A.B.T.A. and can arrange holidays in any part of the world, including your foreign currency requirements. The Travel Bureau is in the new Central Premises, College Lane, Tamworth.

MEMBERS' ATTENTION is directed to Rule XX, whereby they may nominate the party to whom the money standing to their credit may be paid at their decease. If Members would attend to this rule the money could be transferred at their death free of expense and those entitled to receive the money saved a considerable amount of trouble.

A new law has raised to £1,500 the total amount which may be nominated, but this applies to nominations made on or after 8th September, 1975.

Nominations made before that date are still valid, but up to £100, £200 or £500 only. Members wishing to take advantage of the increased amount now allowed, must make a new nomination.

Full information may be obtained from the Office.

SHARES.—Maximum holding may now be increased to £5,000.

SMALL SAVINGS BANK.—Deposits are received at any time during office hours. Sums from 1p to £2 may be deposited, but not more than £50 can be on deposit at one time.

LOANS.—Deposits received at any time during office hours.

MEMBERS CHANGING THEIR ADDRESS should inform the Registered Office immediately.

TWENTY WEEKS' CLUB.—We have in operation a Twenty Weeks' Club, for goods from the Furnishing, Drapery, Stationery, Outfitting, Boots, Coal, or Chemistry Departments. Vouchers of £5 minimum and £50 maximum are issued from the Office, to be repaid at the rate of 5p per £ per week. Also a Thirty Eight Weeks' Club. Ask for details.

CO-OPERATIVE INSURANCE.—We are in a position to effect Insurances of all kinds—Life, Holiday, Fire, Burglary, Motor, Live Stock, and Accident. Co-operators should realise the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the Office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance business.

WITHDRAWALS of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by the owner of the Shares. The Share Pass Book or Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or to pay money.

SHARE, LOAN, and SMALL SAVINGS BOOKS should be sent in regularly to be made up and audited, and the importance of this cannot be too strongly impressed upon Members. When left, the Pass Card should have the amount standing in the Share Book entered thereon and initialled.

HALF-YEARLY DIVIDEND WILL BE PAID IN THE NEW CENTRAL PREMISES, CHURCH STREET, TAMWORTH, ON THURSDAY FRIDAY, AND SATURDAY, 2nd, 3rd AND 4th OCTOBER, BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 9 a.m. TO NOON, AND 1.30 TO 5 p.m. ON THURSDAY AND FRIDAY AND 9.0 a.m. TO NOON AND 1.30 TO 4.0 p.m. ON SATURDAY. MEMBERS ARE REQUESTED TO BRING THEIR PASS CARDS FOR PRODUCTION AT THE TIME OF PAYMENT.
