# Committee's Report

#### FELLOW MEMBERS.

We present for your consideration and approval this interim report for the current financial year.

#### Membership

The number of members on the register is 30,701, a net increase of 924 on this time last year.

#### Capital and Reserves

The aggregate sum of member subscribed capital together with reserves now stands at £1,967,657 which is a new record figure.

#### Investments

Re-invested capital is also a record at £1,336,759.

#### Trade

The period under review is for 23 weeks since the interim stock taking was deliberately brought forward to avoid the peak holiday period. Total sales amounted to £3,260,725, an increase of £332,675 or 11.4%, raising the annual trade to £7,479,709.

This increase shows an encouraging improvement on the previous six months, particularly in the background of a very welcome fall in the cost of living index, but the pressure on margins especially in the food trade is unrelenting and the smaller branches pose great problems in economic terms. At the time of writing this report nothing has been heard of our appeal for a Superstore on the Tame Valley Estate at Two Gates, but we still maintain that it is urgently needed in this area and it would certainly assist us with this major problem of small units.

Our experience in Footwear over recent years has been very disappointing, but all aspects of this industry have suffered from acute market contractions. In order to meet the new situation the C.W.S. Ltd., together with a number of retail societies formed a national company called Shoefayre. The progress of Shoefayre has impressed us considerably so much so that with effect from the beginning of August we asked them to take over our footwear operation in the main store on a concessionary basis—All members of the staff being offered continued employment on terms no less favourable than at present. We look forward to a much improved service in this department and are confident members will obtain considerable benefits from their National Buying and Marketing Techniques.

Recent improvements to Polesworth and Wood End Branches are beginning to bear fruit and building work has been started at Kingsbury to increase selling space by 25% and convert to self service.

#### Staff

Unfortunately there are few periods when we do not have to say goodbye to loyal and conscientious employees on the occasion of their retirement. There have been four such retirements since our last report in the persons of Mr. Sid Archer, 22 years, Funeral Furnishing, Mr. Bert Jackson, 20 years and Mr. Arthur Bywater, 50 years, Dairy and Mr. Albert Fenn, 18 years, Delivery. We extend to them our grateful thanks and every good wish for the future.

#### **OBITUARY**

Mr. REGINALD JERMY, Aged 48 years. (Store Manager).

The untimely death of our senior departmental Manager was a very sad blow to the whole Society. We extend our deepest sympathy to his wife and family.

#### Interim Dividend

Based on our internal accounts we wish to recommend that the dividend rate should be maintained at 3%. During the current half year members are being asked to co-operate with a new method of calculating their dividend from the Dry Goods Departments. The new system will be extensively advertised and all staff properly briefed so that they may give the maximum help to customers. The success of this change will be beneficial to all concerned and we commend it for your full support.

## Notices of Interest to Every Member

CHRISTMAS SAVING STAMP CLUB—Stamps may be purchased at any time in Departments or the Office. The amount saved can be spent in any Department of the Society. Interest is added at the rate of 5 per cent in addition to full dividend. Further particulars given on application.

CO-OPERATIVE TRAVEL SERVICE.—We are members of the A.B.T.A. and can arrange holidays in any part of the world, including your foreign currency requirements. The Travel Bureau is in the new Central Premises, College Lane, Tamworth.

MEMBERS' ATTENTION is directed to Rule XX, whereby they may nominate the party to whom the money standing to their credit may be paid at their decease. If Members would attend to this rule the money could be transferred at their death free of expense and those entitled to receive the money saved a considerable amount of trouble.

A new law has raised to £1,500 the total amount which may be nominated, but this applies to nominations made on or after 8th September, 1975.

Nominations made before that date are still valid, but up to £100, £200 or £500 only. Members wishing to take advantage of the increased amount now allowed, must make a new nomination.

Full information may be obtained from the Office.

SHARES.—Maximum holding may now be increased to £5,000.

SMALL SAVINGS BANK.—Deposits are received at any time during office hours. Sums from 1p to £2 may be deposited, but not more than £50 can be on deposit at one time.

LOANS.—Deposits received at any time during office hours.

MEMBERS CHANGING THEIR ADDRESS should inform the Registered Office immediately.

TWENTY WEEKS' CLUB.—We have in operation a Twenty Weeks' Club, for goods from the Furnishing, Drapery, Stationery, Outfitting, Boots, Coal, or Chemistry Departments. Vouchers of £5 minimum and £50 maximum are issued from the Office, to be repaid at the rate of 5p per £ per week. Ask for details.

CO-OPERATIVE INSURANCE.—We are in a position to effect Insurances of all kinds—Life, Holiday, Fire, Burglary, Motor, Live Stock, and Accident. Co-operators should realise the necessity of some Insurance and apply at once to the Office for all information relating to the various branches of our Insurance business.

WITHDRAWALS of Share Capital and Dividend can only be paid to the actual owner of the Shares, unless the person sent is provided with written authority and a Notice of Withdrawal Form duly signed by the owner of the Shares. The Share Pass Book or Pass Card must be produced whenever a contribution to or a withdrawal from Shares is made. Children should not be sent to the Office either to receive or to pay money.

SHARE, LOAN, and SMALL SAVINGS BOOKS should be sent in regularly to be made up and audited, and the importance of this cannot be too strongly impressed upon Members. When left, the Pass Card should have the amount standing in the Share Book entered thereon and initialled.
